

Camping Season For Girl Scouts

Registrations are almost completed for the camping season at Smith Creek Girl Scout camp, operated by the Santiam Area Girl Scout Council. There are still places available in the Brownie session, July 24 to 31, open to girls 8 through 10 years of age. Girls are being accepted now for the waiting list for other sessions and will be able to attend camp only if cancellations occur.

The camping season will open July 2, with a family picnic for all Girl Scouts and Brownies and their families in the area, at the camp site, in the Silver Creek Falls Recreation Area. July 5 to 9 will be spent in pre-camp training by the staff, and the first session will open July 10. The camping season will close August 21, after six weeks of activity.

The camping program includes hiking, outdoor cooking, campcraft, nature, swimming, overnight hikes, singing, folk dancing, campfire, dramatics, games and the new feature of horseback riding during the last two weeks. This year a special training program for Senior Girl Scouts during the last two sessions will feature training in primitive camping skills and sharing of skills with younger campers in a program side program. Other camping opportunities sponsored by the Council for Scouts this summer include day camps at Crestwood Acres, south of Salem and in the Silverton city park. This session of day camp opened Monday with 80 girls attending from this area.

Troop camping at Longbow Forest Camp on the south Santiam will be held for girls in the Lebanon and Sweet Home districts. Miss Dorothy Wilson, field director of the council, will direct the day camps and supervise the troop camping. It is estimated that over 600 girls will be camping with the Girl Scouts in this area this summer.
