She was born Feb. 8, 1867, at Montreal, Canada, and moved with her family to Chicago, where she was married Nov. 17, 1887. They moved to Idaho in 1910 and on to Salem in 1922.

Bates of Santa Monica, Calif.; a sister, Minnie Scott of Evanston, Ill.; 21 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

All of her children had visited her here two weeks ago before her condition became critical. Services will be Tuesday at 3 p.m. at Clough-Barrick chapel with Dr. Chester W. Hamblin officiating. Interment will be at Belcrest Memorial park.

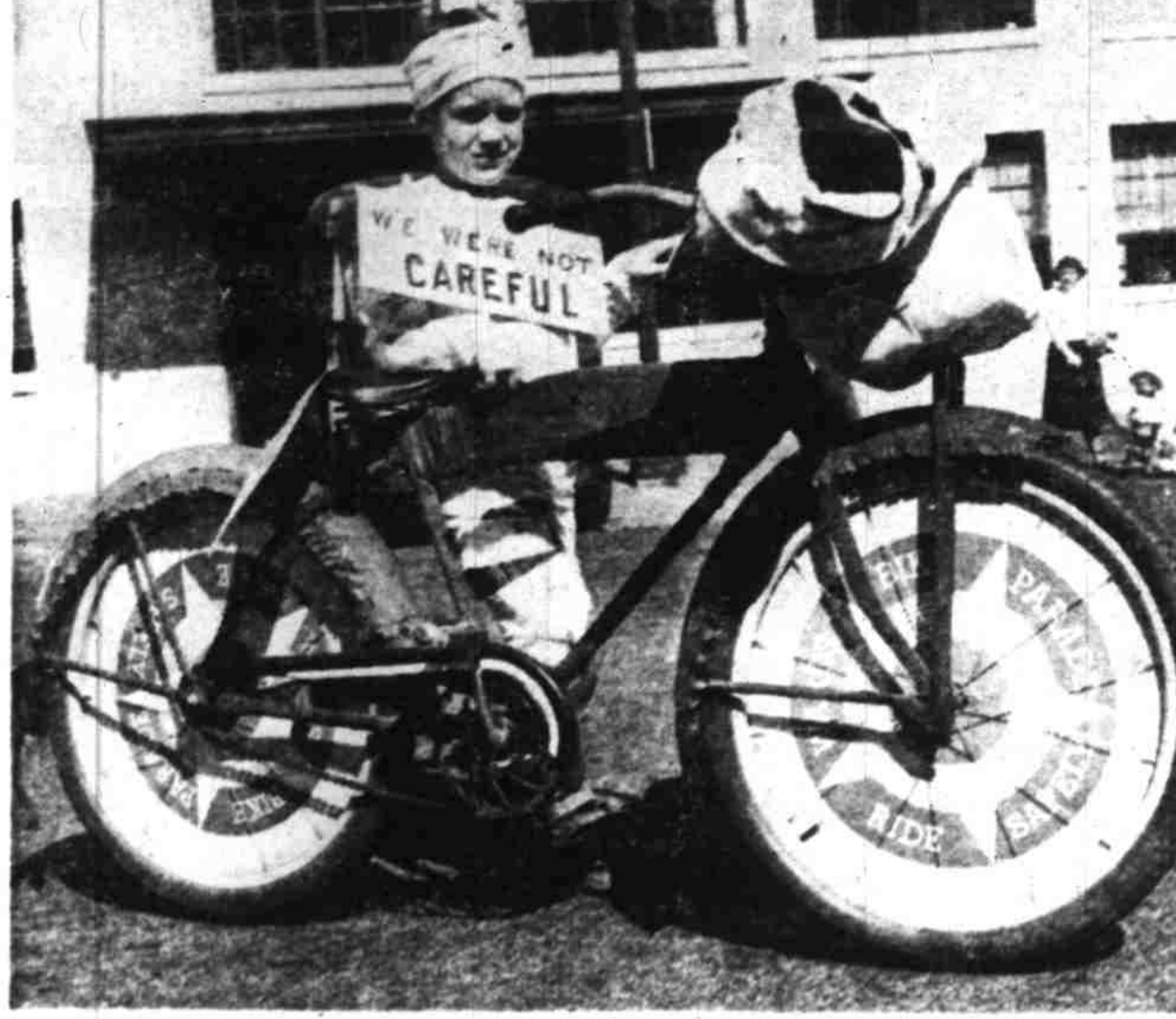
