corn was 1% to 2 cents lower, oats were 11/4-11/2 lower, rye was 11/4-2% lower, soybeans were 2½ to 4 cents lower and lard was 8 to 30 cents a hundred pounds lower.

In addition to delaying harvesting, the rains undoubtedly have cut wheat production and quality in the southwest, grain experts said. The area still will produce a big crop, but trade sentiment generally was agreed that last week's agriculture department crop report saw the top estimate of the year on wheat.

The bread cereal started to sink when word came in that cash prices | were not holding. Kansas City dealers were buying wheat on a to-arrive basis from the new crop. to 4 to 7 cents under Saturday. Spot prices at Kansas City fell 11/2 to 10 cents. Smaller losses were made at Minneapolis.


