Three Vikings On Star Team

EUGENE, June 17—(Special) The 1949 Big Six league baseball all-star team, chosen by the league coaches, lists five players from Eugene, three from Salem,



three from Albany and one from Corvallis. The only unanimous choice was Pitcher George (Junior) Simons of Albany.

The five Eugene players are Pitcher Gene Lewis, Shortstop Jim Barnes, Outfielder Don Stegmann and utility players Mel Jeffries and Delmar Peake. Salem's trio is Second-sacker Bud Duval who led the league in hitting with a .458 average; Outfielder Frank Osborn who hit .346 and All-around-man Jim Rock who managed a .417 batting average (second best in the loop) as well as a number of hitting victories.

Besides Simons, Albany landed Outfielder Jimmy Jenks and Third-baseman Byron Robinson. Corvallis' lone player is Jack Van Loan, catcher.

Among the "honorable mentions" are Pitcher Gene Farmer and First-baseman Keith Garnar of the Vikings.

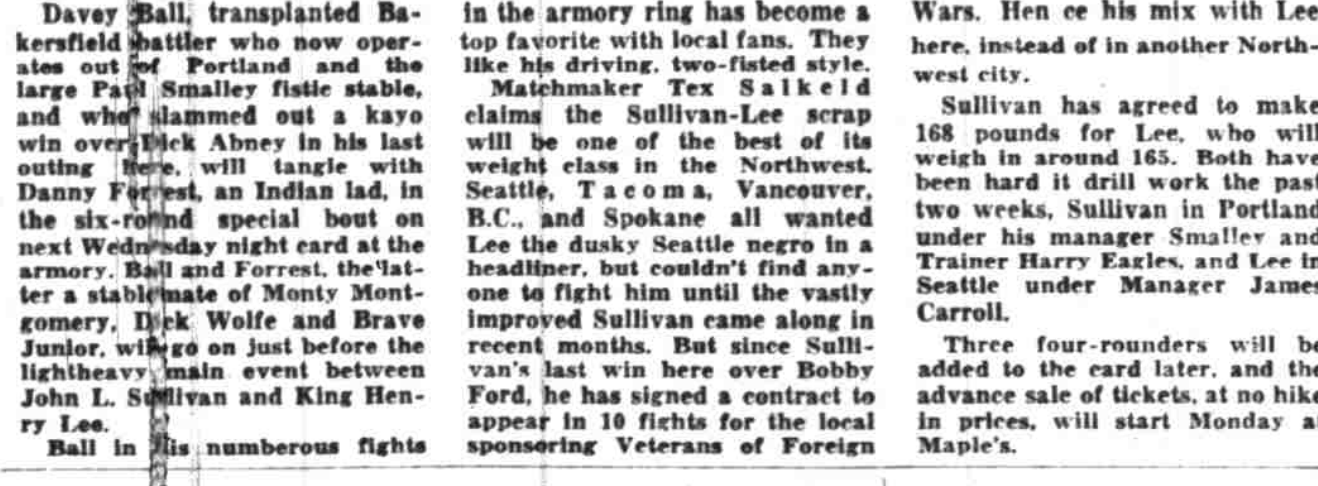

REACH TENNIS FINALS

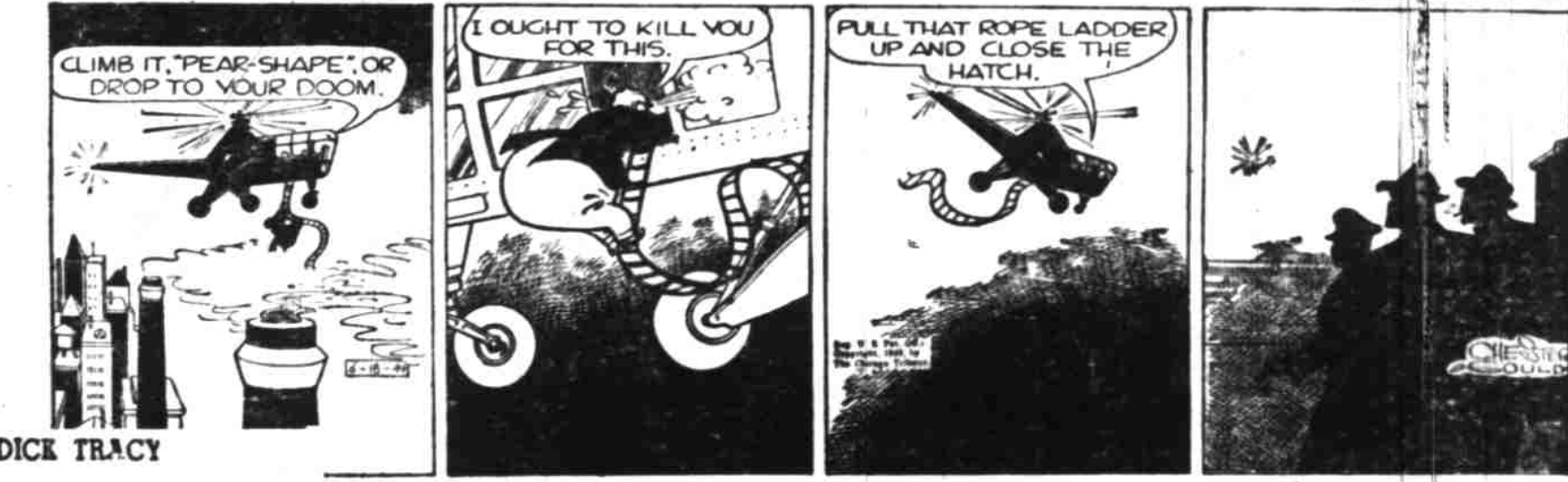
