Sullivan-Lee Winner Gets Bout With Snapp

A brand new development in the John L. Sullivan vs King Henry Lee lightweight scrap at the armory Wednesday night: The winner, reports Matchmaker Tex Salkeld, will get another main event on the next Salem show, against Jack (Ginger) Snapp, the Klamath Falls climber.

Sullivan fought with Snapp in Tacoma recently, and lost a punch-packed decision which was disputed by not only John L. and his handlers but by most of the customers who watched it. Consequently, the dapper Portlander who has come into his own as a battler in recent months wants Heap's additional claims in the pugilistic pot, Sullivan is possessor of a 10-round draw with Bobby Volk, obtained in Portland May 3, and figures he had that one in the bag also. Snapp has two wins over Volk, but was knocked down by the Portlander southpaw both times before he got the victories.

King Henry, the fierce-appearing Seattle negro made short work of Volk in his only Salem appearance. He slammed out a knock-out in 52 seconds of the first round by landing a terrific left on Volk's eye, paralyzing the Portlander for some time. It is no secret that all middleweights in the Northwest something they can't afford to be doing much longer.

Lee will weigh right around 164 pounds for the Wednesday scrap. Sullivan, usually a 172 pounder, will make a 168 maximum for the mix. He has posted weight money to that effect.
