Mrs. Todd Files Guilty Plea on Charge of Aiding Escape Try

Mrs. Dolores Todd, who aided her husband, Jack O'Neill Todd, in an unsuccessful escape attempt from Marion county jail June 5, will be sentenced at 11 a. m., July 1 after pleading guilty in circuit court Monday. Five other escape cases were in court Monday.

Mrs. Todd waived both grand jury investigation and time for sentencing Judge George Duncan's circuit court. Her case was continued for pre-sentence investigation.

She was arrested June 8 by Sheriff Denver Young in her home at 2270 N. 4th st. She also has been bound over to the grand jury on a charge of unlawful possession of narcotics.

Other Cases Tried
Eight other cases were tried in circuit court Monday, including those of three state prison convicts charged with arson in connection with the flax shed fire at the prison last November during an attempted escape.

Paul LeRoy Gardner was sentenced to two years in the state prison, the sentence to run consecutively with his present sentence.

Reuben Partlow, jr., was sentenced to one year in the state prison. He requested the court to appoint an attorney for appeal.

The third convict, John Edward Ralph, pleaded innocent to the arson charge, and his case was continued for setting a trial date.

Pleads Innocent
Clyde L. Maitland pleaded innocent to a charge of escape from the state prison and his case also was continued for trial date.

Lawrence Osterman was appointed attorney by the court for Donald O. Jones, charged with escape, and the case was continued to July 1 for arraignment.

Imposition of sentence was suspended for Nellie Axberg, charged with obtaining money by false pretenses. She was placed on probation for two years.

Robert Osborn, charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor, received a one-year suspended county jail sentence, and was placed on probation three years.

Leslie Grazier pleaded guilty to a charge of obtaining money by false pretenses after waiving grand jury investigation. He received a six-months suspended county jail sentence.

tion KSTL in Hollywood, Calif., at his home just east of Brooks Friday night.

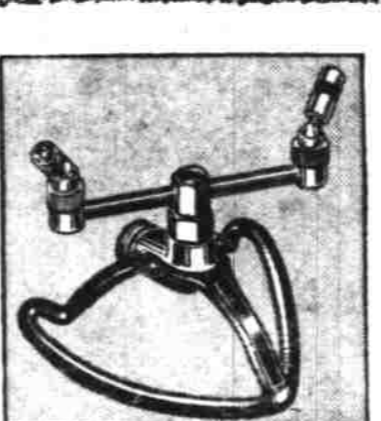
The reception from a distance of approximately 1,000 miles, was similar to the contact between Canada and Texas reported by the Associated Press Sunday.

Television range normally is restricted to a range of approximately 75 miles, although Klampe reports "fair to poor" reception from Seattle occasionally.

Closest television stations to Salem are Seattle and San Francisco. Klampe said his reception from Hollywood Friday night was perfect, even though his antenna was directed to Seattle. He received both the pictures and the sound. Normally he gets either one or the other.

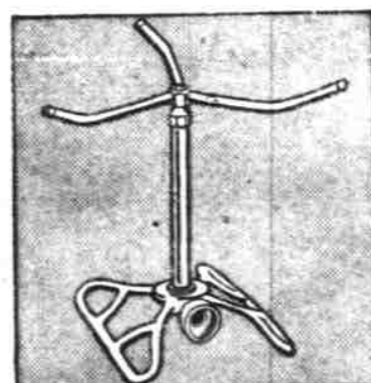
