

Todd Handed 3-Year Term For Larceny

Jack O'Neil Todd pleaded guilty to larceny Wednesday in Judge George Duncan's circuit court and was sentenced to three years in the state prison.

Todd was arrested May 19 by city police for stealing an auto owned by Reinhold Blum, 1925 N. Liberty st. On June 6 he sawed his way out of the Marion county jail but dropped into the waiting arms of Sheriff Denver Young and four deputies.

District Attorney E. O. Stader has not decided whether to take action on the escape charge.

Todd's wife, Dolores, pleaded guilty June 20 to helping her husband in his escape attempt and is scheduled for sentencing Friday. She has been bound over to the grand jury on another charge of illegal possession of narcotics.

In other court action, Clifford Eugene Hummell pleaded guilty to larceny of an auto from Scott A. Wheatley and was ordered to the state hospital 30 days for observation before imposition of sentence.

Hummell was arrested by state police May 22. He gave his address as Masury, Ohio.

Richard Fones received a one-year suspended sentence for non-support and was placed on probation three years. The court ordered him to pay \$50 monthly support money to his former wife, Selma Fones, and their children.

His wife is under indictment charged with larceny of \$1,100 from Willamette university where she worked.

Alcohol Tests Catching Up to Drunk Drivers

PORTLAND, June 29-(AP)—Science slowly is catching up with the drunken driver, delegates to the Western Safety conference heard here.

For 100 years scientists have been working on chemical tests for intoxication, Jack Whittall, Chicago, secretary of a national committee on such tests, told the group.

Now, he continued, the tests are absolute, and the results sometimes spectacular. Their use is spreading slowly, he said, with ten states now having laws permitting or requiring the tests.

He cited Detroit's experience with the tests. In the three years they have been used, there, traffic fatalities in which intoxication was a factor have been reduced 70 per cent, Whittall said.

Chemical tests are not based on the amount of alcohol consumed, but on the amount found in the blood, or breath, he explained. The point of intoxication is .15 per cent, he asserted.

Franklin M. Krenl, director of the Northwestern university traffic institute, advised safety engineers not to overlook rural areas as points of danger. In fact, he continued, the traffic death rate in the country and small towns is twice that of the cities.

Other speakers again urged extension of safety courses into grade and high schools.

Penton Jail Breaker Caught In New Mexico

Richard Howard Hall, who escaped from the Benton county jail June 4, with outside help, is under arrest in New Mexico on a car theft charge, state police were advised here Wednesday.

A police said they probably would return Hall to Benton county where he was being held on a forged court. He originally was arrested at Mason City, Ia., and returned to Corvallis.

At the time he escaped he stole from the sheriff's office a pistol, some ammunition, handcuffs and legions.

Gasoline Sales Reach Record High In State

Gasoline sales in Oregon from January 8 to May 31 this year aggregated 171,792,550 gallons as against 168,724,454 gallons during the similar period in 1948. Secretary of State Earl T. Newby announced Wednesday.

Gasoline tax collections during the first five months of this year aggregated \$8,589,627.49 as compared to \$8,436,373.73 in the same period in 1948. The sales increased 3,065,095 gallons and the tax \$153,254.

O and C Lists Timber Units For 1950 Sale

PORTLAND, June 29-(Special)—About 58,000,000 board feet of timber in the Salem district of O & C lands will be available in 1950 for purchase, it was announced today by Daniel L. Goldy, regional administrator.

Persons interested are to submit suggestions as to the specific tracts of timber they wish to have advertised for bids, and the time. The suggestions must be submitted by August 15.

While the new procedure, according to Goldy, eliminates formal applications, the first such sale will not be conducted until February 1950. Sales will continue to be conducted during the calendar year 1949 under the procedures heretofore in use. Accordingly, formal applications for the September 1949 sale will be received until July 1, and applications for the November 1949 sale will be received until September 1.

In the Salem district of the O & C area, District Forester A. P. Collins, 460 N. High st., Salem, will consider suggestions for the advertising for sale, specific areas in specific administrative units up to the approximate volumes (in millions of board feet) in the following list:

Leed's Store Has New Program of Health Insurance

A new health insurance plan, covering nearly all employees and paid for in large part by the management, was announced for Leed's Shoe stores Wednesday by Andrew Nowak, manager.

The plan calls for payment of medical, surgical and hospital care for employees and their dependents, and also will mean individual low-cost life insurance policies ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,500, depending on income, and weekly sick benefits totaling 70 per cent of an employee's earnings. The hospitalization feature provides up to \$9 a day, the time depending on earnings.

The new program is in addition to the Leed's pension plan, set up in 1944, which now has a fund of \$860,000. The Leed's store is a subsidiary to Edson Brothers stores operating 209 businesses in 36 states.

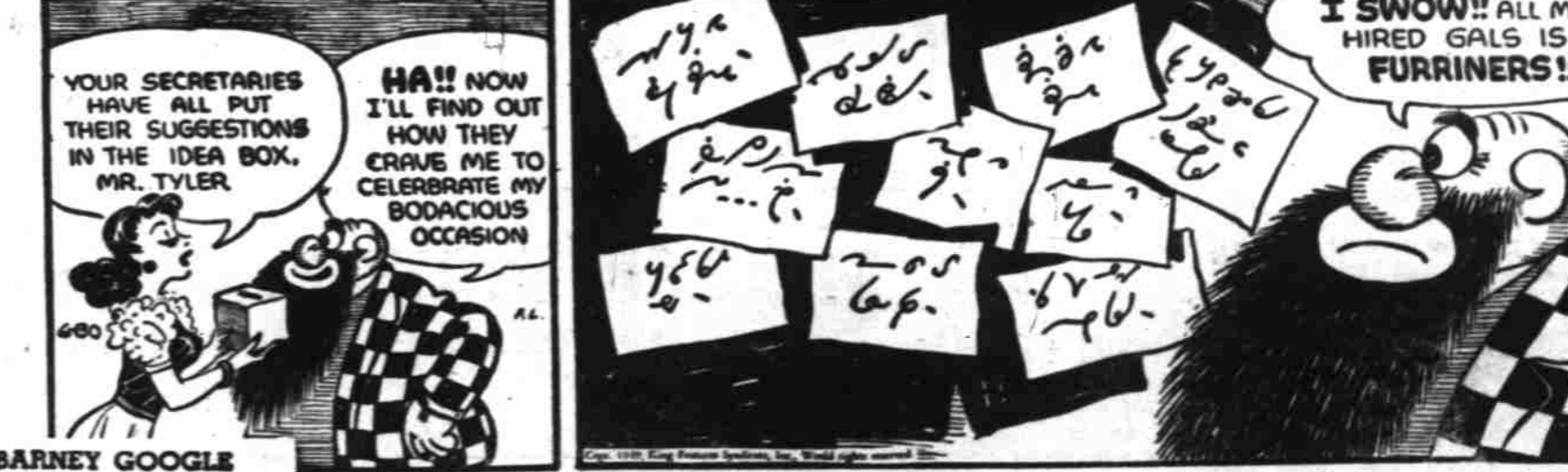
