### **Legion Starts** Drive to Add to **Employment**

WASHINGTON, July 4 - (P) The American Legion Sunday launched a nationwide "grass roots" drive for new jobs with the accent on community self-

Legion Commander Perry Brown said it is to be a hometown effort "to bring back to modern America the old pioneer spirit of self-reliance through self-help in solving local economic problems.

"Individuals, communities and states must learn again to stand on their own feet if this country is to be saved from going socialistic," Brown said.

'Government Must Act' Meanwhile, Senator Murray (D-Mont) said in a radio interview that the federal government must act now to prevent any "serious recession" developing in the nation's economy. He pointed to general industrial slowdowns "in many sections" and spots of "serious ui employment." He said it is a national problem.

"Only the government can take appropriate steps to aid business in a situation of this kind," Murray said.

He said it was failure to take appropriate steps in time that permitted "the last depression" to become a "catastrophe."


