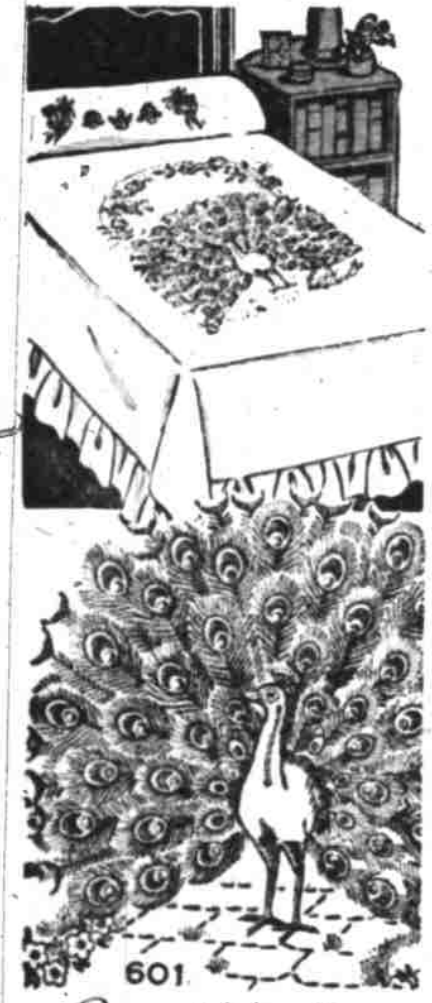

A native of Alsace-Lorraine, Spaniol was brought to the United States and to Minnesota by his parents when he was three years old. He came to Stayton sometime in the 1890's and started in

business in 1902, in the same building which housed the M. Streff and company, furniture and hardware store. Streff was his father-in-law.

About 1913, a cement block building was built on Ida street and it has since housed the business.

Eugene Spaniol, who has practically grown up in the business, joined his father in the firm in 1940.

Recently articles of incorporation for a new firm were filed with Eugene and Ryth Spaniol, Jerry and Dora Marking, and Robert and Colleen O'Connor forming a new firm to be known as Spaniol and Company, plumbing and heating.
