

Salem Bus Fares to Increase Thursday After PUC Sanction

City Transit lines will increase bus fares Thursday in Salem and between the city and suburban areas, Manager Robert J. Davidson said Tuesday.

Fare increases were authorized Monday by the state public utilities commission. The city council approved increases within the city June 27.

Bus fares in Salem will be 10 cents straight for adults and 5 cents for children, ages 5 through 11. Twenty-ride school tickets will be \$1.20.

City fares have been 10 cents, but tokens were sold three for 25 cents.

Interzone fares, between the city and suburban areas, will be 20 cents for adults, but tokens will be sold two for 35 cents. Children's fares will be 10 cents straight, and school tickets will be sold 50 for \$5.

Three-zone fares, from a suburban area through the city to another suburban area, will be 30 cents or one suburban token plus 10 cents for adults and 15 cents for children.

Davidson said tokens now being used will not be valid Thursday, except that one token plus two cents may be used for single zone fares and two tokens plus one cent for interzone fares.

Tokens will be redeemed, three for 25 cents, at the bus office, 636 N. Front st., Davidson said.

The total interzone fare will be paid on entering the bus, while in paying three zone fares, one token or 20 cents will be deposited on entering the bus plus another 10 cents on leaving the bus, the manager said.

Davidson added that free transfer privileges are still available, and he said cards will be placed on all buses today listing fare increases.

Court Starts Vacation; OKs Eugene Ballot

An election held in Eugene last November, at which the city annexed the South Willamette street area, was valid, the state supreme court held Tuesday.

The court then recessed until September 6, subject to call to hear an emergency proceeding.

The Eugene election was contested by Charles Witham, a brewer operator, who resides in the annexed territory. Witham alleged the election was illegal because insufficient notices were posted, that persons favoring the annexation electioneered near the polls, and that ballots were given persons not living in the territory annexed.

The supreme court opinion was written by Justice James T. Brand and affirmed a circuit court ruling.

Other decisions Tuesday included affirmation of a Marion county circuit court order appealed by

city bus lines could not provide safe and adequate transportation while operating at a loss. The company had testified at a hearing June 3 that \$20,910 was lost during the first five months of 1949 in Salem, Eugene and Springfield, and also were authorized.

AEC Inquiry To Be Closed

WASHINGTON, July 12 (AP)—The public inquiry into handling of the nation's atomic program ended Monday—at least temporarily—with no sign of the fiery dramatics with which it opened more than six weeks ago.

But congressional investigators weighing charges of "incredible mismanagement" leveled against David E. Lilienthal by Senator Hickenlooper (R-Iowa) still have more work ahead. They will begin tomorrow a closed door hearing into security matters.

Lilienthal, chairman of the atomic energy commission, completed his rebuttal of Hickenlooper's original evidence today.

NEW YORK, July 12 (AP)—The stock market hit a forward stride again today, after faltering for the past three sessions, and closed at the highest level since late May.

At the final bell a decisive majority of stocks were up fractions to around a point and in some cases more. A spattering of losses were mostly in small fractions.

Volume of business expanded as prices wormed their way ahead. Turnover of 870,000 shares was helped along by heavy trade in Commonwealth & Southern.

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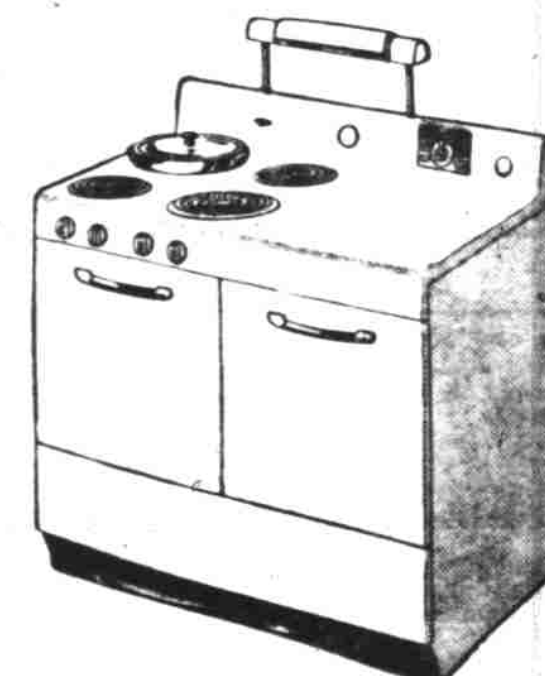
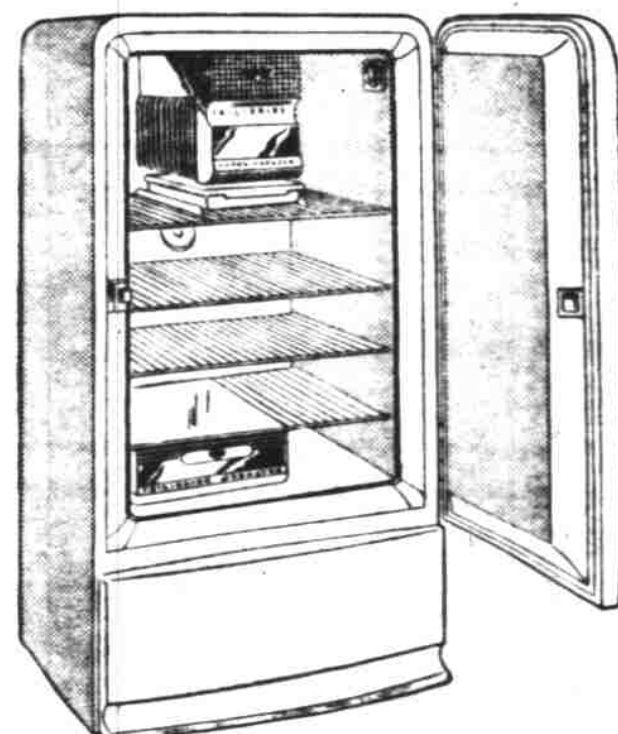
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
