Strangulation, Suicide Occur In Nome Jail

NOME, Alaska, July 24-(AP)-A youthful matron and a young man were found dangling last week from cell doors in the Nome City - Both strangled by cloth fail strips from torn mattreess covers. Their deaths, three days apart, were disclosed today.

Coroner's juries ruled the man committed suicide, the woman was strangled "by a person or persons unknown." A full-scale investigation is expected.

Alfred Blatc' ord, 25, was discovered early Thursday hanging from the door of the, "bull pen" where he had been locked up with several other prisoners after his arrest a few hours earlier. His neck had been broken. Said Suicide

A coroner's jury deliberated 10 hours and then returned a verdict of suicide.

Others in the cell with Blatchford were questioned. None had raised an outcry over his death. He had been picked up for fighting and disorderly conduct about midnight Wednesday and put in the large "tank" with a number of prisoners, some of whom were minors charged with drunkenness. Asked to Appear

Blatchford's body was found when the prisoners were called out to appear for trial before the city magistrate.

An hourly checkup of the cells was ordered the same day by Mayor Steve Andersen.

Lott, about 25, was arrested and held without charge. Three-quar-ters of an hour later Chief W. W. Laws, making his hourly rounds, discovered Mrs. Lott's body suspended from her cell door, a piece of the mattress cover looped a-

round her neck. Another coroner's jury was called and pondered four hours before bringing in a verdict of murder by strangulation. No explanation was given on how other persons in the jail could have slain her.
