

WASHINGTON, July 26 -(AP)-President Truman, who in the past has had some biting things to say about the American press, spoke a good word today.

He told a group of German and Austrian editors and publishers that the United States has a "great many wonderful newspapers." Mr. fruman did not name any he had in mind.

The president received the foreign newspapermen in the rose garden of the White House where he posed for photographs with them. He said he understood that the visitors had heard it wouldn't be possible to be photographed with the United States' chief executive and he wanted to give them their opportunity to have this done.

The foreign newsmen-19 Ger-mans and 3 Austrians-arrived here Monday for a four day stay in the capital to observe the way government officials meet with newspapermen. Their visit to this country was arranged by the office of education.
