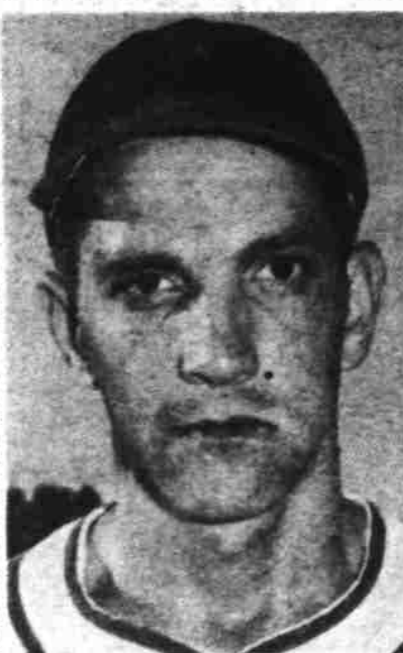


SPORTS LIGHTNER

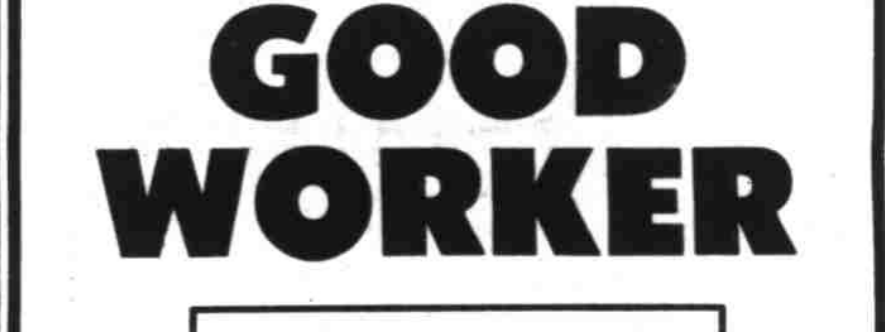
