State Leader Owens Greets Legionnaires

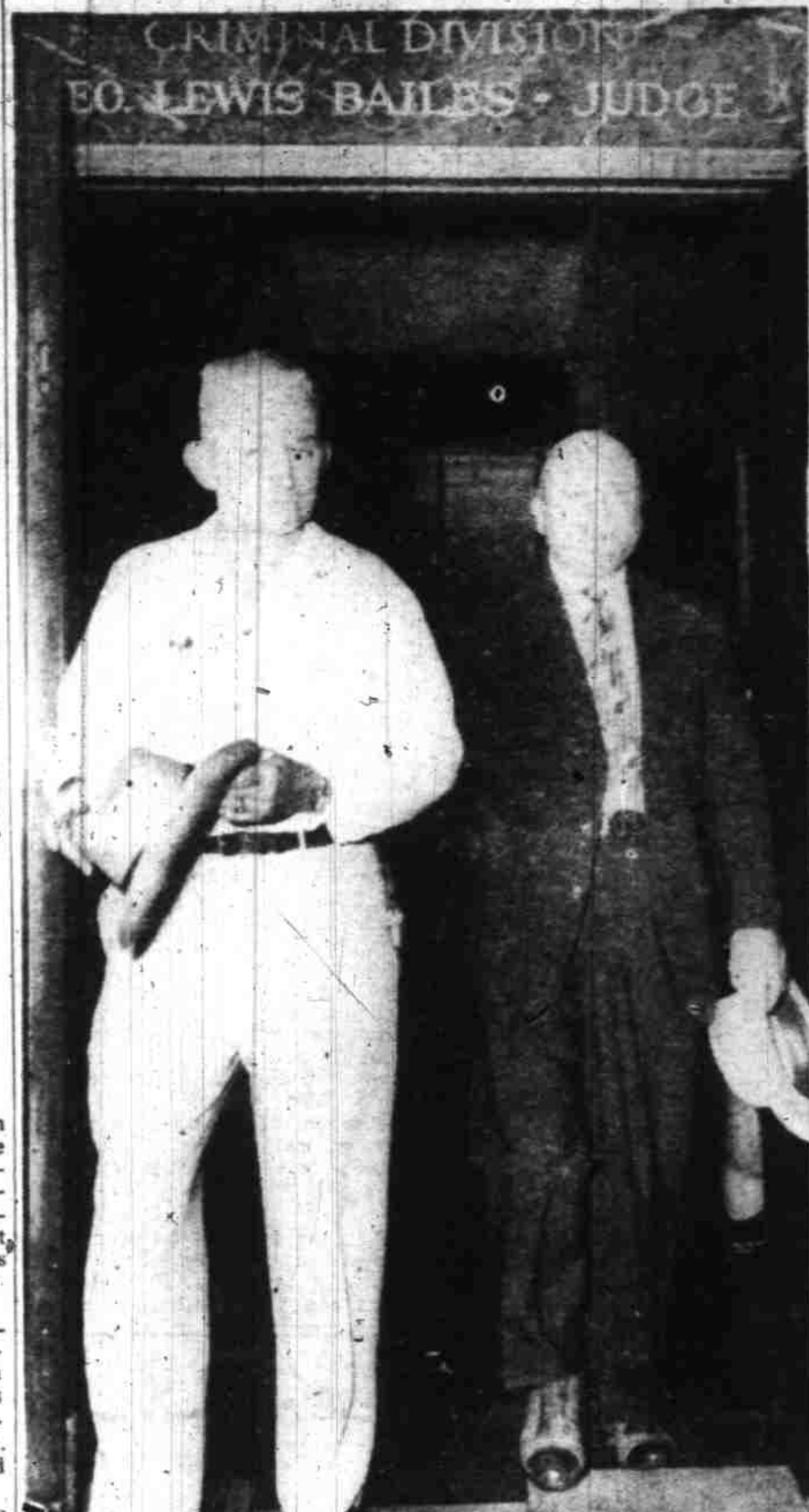

Teacher Lack Still Worry For Oregon

Most Oregon schools again will face a serious teacher shortage in September, despite that the high school situation has improved slightly, Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction, asserted Tuesday.

Putnam said he based his prediction on the number of teacher applications received at his office in recent weeks.

Approximately 1,000 emergency teacher certificates have been issued to elementary teachers with prospects that this number will be increased by 700 before the schools resume operations. There were 1,700 of these permits issued last year.

No emergency certificates are being issued this year for teachers in high schools, Putnam said. There were 72 certificates issued to high school teachers last year. A small increase is noted in the teacher supply from the Oregon Colleges of Education. Putnam continued, but this supply is far short of the prewar normal.

Farm and home loans aggregating a trifle less than \$600,000 were processed by the state veterans affairs department during July, department officials reported Tuesday.

This was the lowest number of loans approved for several months although the number of applications received were about the same as in previous months.

Purpose of the planning commission is to advise in connection with expansion of the state capitol area and construction of new state buildings. R. W. Sawyer, Bend newspaper publisher, is chairman of the planning commission.

Bartlett Quiet On Charges of Board Waste

Director W. M. Bartlett of the state board of aeronautics Tuesday declined to comment on charges that the board has wasted funds in promoting useless projects and that he is not qualified for the position of director under the Oregon laws.

Bartlett said any statement would have to come from the board members.

Gov. Douglas McKay, in a statement Monday, said he had referred the charges to the aeronautics board. Charges against the board and Bartlett came from Oregon's Flying Farmers and other aviation groups.
