

White Leads in Tam Money Chase

Palmer Trails By One Stroke

Half-way Point Hit In Race for \$10,000

CHICAGO, Aug. 12 (AP)—Buck White's seven-under-par 65 today gave him a halfway whisker in the bunched chase of par-busters sprinting for the \$10,000 first prize of the Tam O'Shanter World Golf Meet.

A pro for 30 years, White coupled his blistering 34-31-65 with an opening round 70 which left him nine under par. Despite this superb shooting, the Greenwood, Miss., veteran, could boast only a one-stroke edge over Johnny Palmer of Badin, N. C., and only a two-stroke margin over four other money hounds clustered at 137.

White, who lost to Byron Nelson in a playoff for 1943 Tam honors, needed only 28 putts in fashioning his 65, lowest second round tally which was matched by defending champion Lloyd Mangrum.

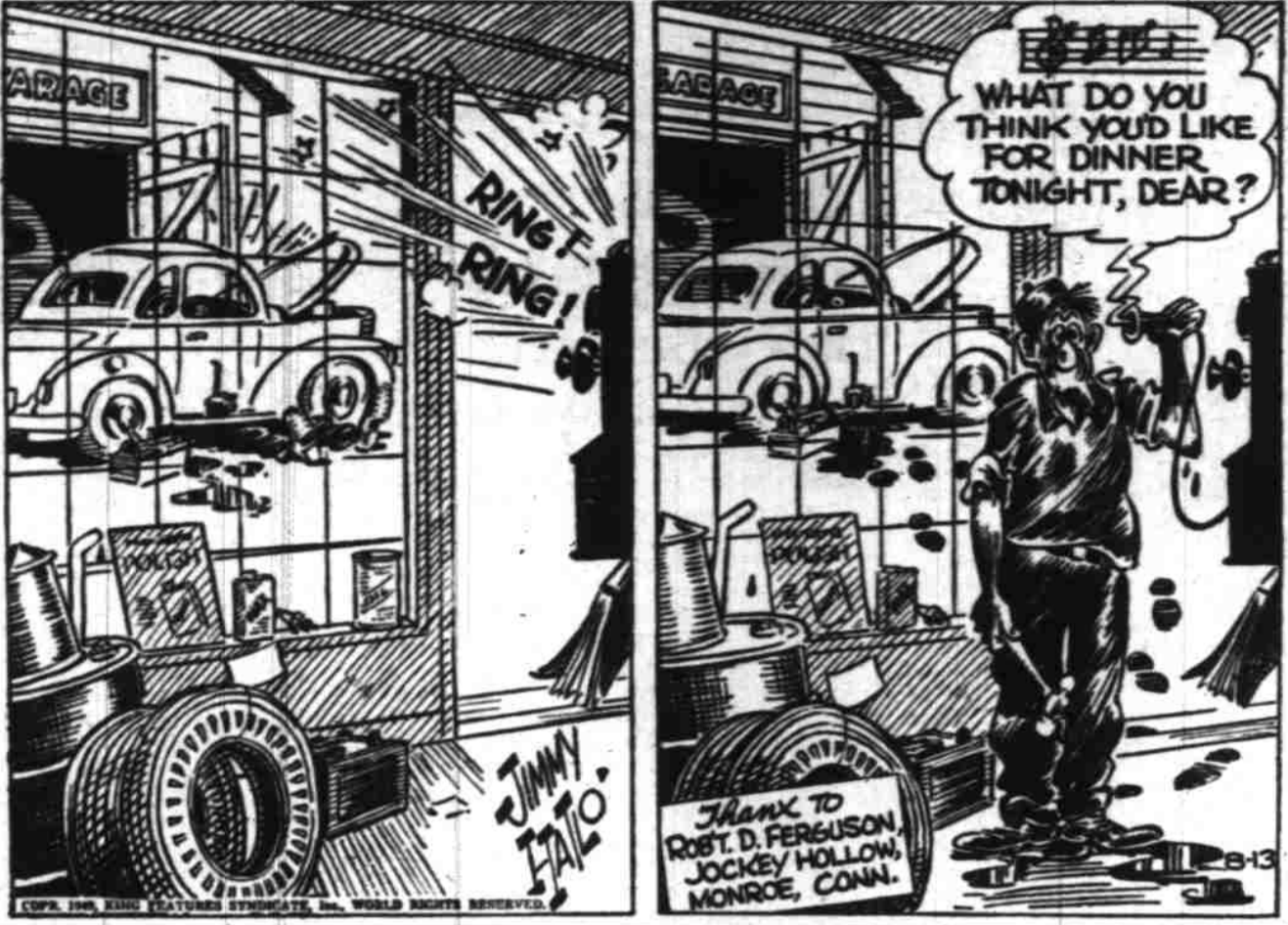
Palmer banded a 69 after starting with 67 to total 136. Palmer, fourth leading money winner of the season and runner-up of the 1949 National P.G.A. title, dropped in a 10-foot birdie putt on the last hole to gain second place. Deadlocked in third with 137 were Clayton Heafner of Charlotte, N. C., with a 71 after a first round leading 66; Henry Ransom of Chicago with 70; Jimmy Demaret of Ojai, Calif., 68 and Jim Turnesa of Briarcliff, N. Y., 69.

Grouped at 136 were d Furgol, Royal Oaks, Mich., with a 70 today; Bob Hamilton, Landover, Md., 35-31-66; and Sam Snead, who tops the financial list with \$25,893, with a rallying pair of 63 and 66. Snead was far behind in the par-busting jubilee after a standard 72 yesterday.

Close races also were developing in the other three "world" tournament sections of the Tam jubilee. Defending Champion Bill Campbell of Huntington, W. Va., a member of the state legislature, rebounded with a 67 for 143 and the lead of the men's amateur category.

Babe Zaharias of Denver, Colo., added a three-under-par 73 for a halfway 147 and top spot in the women's pro section. Patty Berg of Minneapolis was next with 76 for 150. Grace Lenzyk, national amateur champion from Hartford, Conn., grabbed the women's amateur lead with 79 for 157.

Among top drivers set to go tonight are Bob Gregg, Gordy Livingston, Darmond Moore and Eric Koch, all of Portland, and Len Sutton, the 1948 roadster champion of the Northwest who holds the local track record for the "rods."

Time trials tonight will start at 8 o'clock. The program will carry the usual helmet dash, heat races and a 10-lap semi.
