

Court Orders Strikebound Ship Unloaded

HONOLULU, Aug. 13—(P)—Federal District Judge J. Frank McLaughlin today ordered the U.S. marshal to seize the strikebound freighter Hawaiian Farmer long enough to unload \$750,000 worth of mixed cargo.

He acted on application of 175 consignees when counsel for striking stevedores of the CIO International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union stated the union could not post a \$250,000 bond required for appealing the case to the federal circuit court of appeals. He first had ordered the seizure July 22, then stayed it to give the union a chance to appeal.

Since the stevedores went on strike 105 days ago, several consignments aboard strikebound ships have been unloaded through federal court action. The union contends this is a misuse of admiralty law.

When Judge McLaughlin ordered the seizure today, counsel for the ship's owners, the Matson line, asked that he reconsider, since the territorial government is preparing to go into the stevedoring business in an effort to end the strike.

Counsel for the consignees also said they would like a chance to investigate the territory's stevedoring program.

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Bramuglia Quits Peron Cabinet, Called on to Duel

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, Aug. 13—(P)—President Juan Peron today cut loose from his distinguished foreign minister, Juan Bramuglia, who at the same time was challenged to a duel.

Bramuglia, who resigned two days ago, was challenged to fight by Jeronimo Remorino, Argentine ambassador to the United States. Bramuglia was reported to have struck Remorino in the face with his fist when they met and had a bitter argument.

President Peron interrupted his week-end holiday today and after meeting with several ministers accepted Bramuglia's resignation.

RFC Loan for Europe Arms Aid Protested

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13—(P)—The foreign arms program bumped into a new controversy today when Senator Maybank (D-SC) charged the administration with trying to short circuit congressional action through a reconstruction finance corp loan.

Reacting to reports that Secretary of State Acheson favors such a loan to speed the furnishing of arms to western European nations, Maybank summoned RFC officials before the banking committee for a public hearing Monday.

At the same time, Chairman Connally (D-Tex) of the foreign relations committee conceded there has been discussion of a plan to write into the pending \$1,450,000,000 foreign military bill a provision under which up to \$800,000,000 could be borrowed from the RFC to start the program rolling once congress approves it.

Storm Saves China Isles

CANTON, Sunday, Aug. 14—(P)—The elements have saved from capture the northern Miao islands, from which the nationalists are blockading the great port of Tientsin, official reports asserted today.

Europe Council Adopts 9-Point Work Program

STRASBOURG, France, Aug. 13—The Council of Europe adopted tonight a nine-point work program for its drive to pull the war-battered countries of the old world closer together. At the same time it ruled out any specific discussion of Irish partition.

The council's committee of ministers approved an agenda which was drawn up earlier by the consultative assembly's 101 delegates, and which will keep them busy for at least several weeks.

The nine-point agenda provides for debate on such items as political changes necessary in Europe to bring about greater unity of member nations, and human rights and fundamental freedoms.

There were among six points added today by the consultative assembly to three points originally proposed by the ministers' committee.

The addition of the six points was a victory for Winston Churchill and the majority in the assembly. None of the points covers military subjects, since the committee and the assembly agreed this was not within the competence of the Council of Europe.

The touchy nationalistic issue over Ireland was ruled out as a problem for debate during today's talk on possible agenda items. Eamon De Valera, former prime minister of Ireland, made two determined efforts to put the dispute with Britain over northern Ireland on the program. The assembly rejected De Valera's suggestion by an overwhelming show of hands.

From British Delegates
Strong opposition to the Irishman's proposal came from most of the British delegates. The six counties of northern Ireland have since 1921 been part of the United Kingdom along with England, Scotland and Wales.

The Irish proposal was for the assembly to discuss the best way to eliminate causes of disputes between member states. Previously, Ireland's Foreign Minister, Sean MacBride, had made it clear he considered the partition of northern Ireland a cause of dispute between Britain and the Irish Republic.

Elliott, MacDonald Kin Figure In Oregon City Police Inquiry

OREGON CITY, Aug. 13—(P)—A fight in which a city policeman was beaten here early today resulted in the arrest of one man and the removal from duty of the policeman during an investigation.

The policeman was Bernard T. L. Naeger, who suffered head wounds and body bruises. He said he went to investigate a party where noise had been reported in early morning. A fight resulted. Naeger said he was ganged by several members of the party. They complained Naeger's gun was fired twice. No one was hit by the shots.

Police Chief Glen MacDonald relieved Naeger from duty, pending the investigation.

The case had overtones of the neighboring Multnomah county controversy over Sheriff Marion Leroy (Mike) Elliott.

Chief MacDonald is the brother of Stanley MacDonald, criminologist recently suspended by Sheriff Elliott. Naeger is Elliott's brother-in-law. Chief MacDonald pointedly refrained from suspending Naeger, thus assuring that Naeger's pay would continue. Stanley MacDonald was not paid in his month's suspension, which ended when Elliott announced he was withdrawing insubordination charges and was reinstating MacDonald "without prejudice."

Naeger was a city policeman in Portland last year, but was dismissed a few days before his temporary appointment would have become permanent.

Key Army Role Awaits Clark

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13—(P)—Gen. Mark Clark is slated for a key new assignment in the present military reshuffle, it was learned tonight.

An informed official indicated that Clark is to be chief of army field forces, succeeding Gen. Jacob Devers, who is retiring in September. Devers will be 62 years old Sept. 8 and he will have served 44 years on active duty.

Clark now is commander of the Sixth army with headquarters in San Francisco. At the end of the last war he commanded the 15th army group composed of the U.S. Fifth army and British Eighth.

CHRONIC SCHOOL-HATER

ENTERPRISE, Aug. 13—(P)—Police puzzled today over the case of a school-hating 8-year-old Joseph boy. The lad broke electric light fixtures and clocks in the Joseph high schools for a total damage of \$2,000 two months ago. Now he has broken a dozen windows in the new grade school.

Chinese Hide \$1 Billion as US Investments

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13—(P)—Chinese citizens have secreted well over half a billion dollars in this country, it was estimated today, and four federal agencies are at work to see the communists don't get it.

Drastic government action appears increasingly unlikely, it was said. The Chinese wealth has been skillfully concealed in banks and investments. Neither the Chinese nationalists nor communists may ever lay hands on it.

The security of these and other Chinese assets has been the subject of an intensive study for many weeks, officials disclosed.

The four agencies which have been deeply concerned to prevent a rich windfall from going to the communists are the state department, the treasury department, the federal reserve system and the New York state banking superintendent. Informants here said they have been in almost daily touch.

Boat Explodes, 2 Men Hurt

ASTORIA, Ore., Aug. 13—(P)—An explosion destroyed a Columbia river fishing boat today, but its two occupants were saved after the blast sent them flying into the river.

Passing boats rescued the fishermen. Anton Stanich, 52, suffered severe burns, and Donald Webb, 18, was treated for lesser burns. Webb blamed a gasoline leak for the explosion that set the four-year-old boat, owned by the Columbia River Packers' Association, aflame. The boat sank near Desdemona sands.

Animals Occupy Parking Spaces

NEWBERG, Aug. 13—(P)—Motorists in Newberg found two full blocks of parking space taken up by animals today.

The livestock was tethered to parking meters. It was a part of the annual Berrian Farmaroo with animals tied up there for exhibition and judging.

Portland Airport Project to Start

PORTLAND, Aug. 13—(P)—Portland will award the first contract August 24 for expansion of the

Portland airport into an overseas air terminal.

When completed, the project will have cost about \$2,000,000. Runways will be widened, and the main runway will be lengthened to 8800 feet, the longest on the coast.

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
