

'Rods' in 4th Meet Tonight

Racing Program Set For Hollywood Bowl

Rigged up with a seven-event program, according to Promoter Norm Snodgrass, the racing rosters return to Hollywood Bowl tonight for the fourth speed meeting of the Salem season. Time trials for the glamorized, and fast hot rods will start at eight o'clock. The actual races will get under way around nine.

Top duel of the evening will no doubt come between Salem's Max Humm and the noted Len Sutton. Humm swept all major events during the inaugural meeting here, and last week Sutton came through for the main event victory. The other winner was Howard Osborne. All three will be among the pack tonight. Snodgrass hopes to have between 15 and 20 cars here.

Of cheerful news to those who like their auto racing over the longer route, tonight's mainer will be 35 laps instead of the usual 25, reports Snodgrass. All races will be run reverse handi-cap, the fastest time-ins starting behind the slowpokes.

At present Humm is in the point standings lead over Sutton. The racers operate in Seattle on Friday nights and the driving points captured at Seattle count right along with those mustered here. Humm is 14 points up on Sutton at present, says Snodgrass.

Others due for driving tonight include, with those mentioned, Jim Niday, Randy Francis, Russ Gilbertson, Mickey Shelton and Dick McIvlin.

Preps Continue Shrine Drills

PORTLAND, Aug. 19 - (P) - The Oregon All-Stars worked today on the offensive plays they will use against the Portland All-Stars in the Shrine's hospital game August 27. The upstate team won't start worrying about defense until next week, when practices will revert to one drill daily.

Oregon's starting backfield unit was practically set Friday. Clint Reese, Grants Pass, will be at quarterback, Don Donovan, Grants Pass, and Rich Riggs, Medford, at halfbacks, and Phil Gillis, Bend, at fullback. Coach Mel Ingram wouldn't commit himself definitely to that foursome, but it is the unit that functioned best in practice.

The upstate line, on the other hand, is far from definite with battles as hot as the sun which heat overheard raging for starting positions.

The Portland team, a bigger, faster and better balanced aggregation than the one which lost last year's inaugural, started work on pass defense Friday.

There are two practice sessions slated Saturday to conclude the first week of practice.

Kennedy's last appearance here saw him beat Indian Dick Wolfe in a whale of a scrap. Ball has been here before also and in his last outing kayoed Dean Abney in seven rounds. Salkeld predicts the Kennedy-Ball battle will be a dandy. Both have been appearing on the summer shows at Portland's Jantzen Beach on Tuesday night, and Kennedy recently fought in a main event.

Indian Joe Pete and Dick Collier, both Salem gladiators, will have spots in the four-round prelims. The balance of the card will be announced Sunday by Salkeld.
