

Grandmother Among 4 Said Backing Subversive Activities

PORTLAND, Aug. 25—(AP)—A 64-year-old grandmother, faced with deportation from this country, declared today that she did not even know "what communism is."

Mrs. Karolina Halverson, who came to this country from Sweden as a girl, is one of four Oregonians whom the U. S. immigration service accused of membership in organizations which teach overthrow of the government "by force or violence." The four will be given private hearings on the charges later.

"I do not know the meaning of force and violence," said Mrs. Halverson.

The elderly woman, whose two children and four grandchildren are all U. S. citizens, said the charge against them apparently

stemmed from the workers alliance, which she might have attended during the days of the depression. "But I can't remember—it was so long ago."

The immigration service said the other three were John L. Stenson, 65, West Linn, a Norwegian; Hamish Scott McKay, 43, Portland, a Canadian; and Casimiro Bueno Absolar, 44, a Filipino.

Building Permit Total for Day Near \$75,000

Construction is still booming in Salem, judging by building permits totaling nearly \$75,000 issued Thursday by the city engineer's office.

A \$30,000 permit was issued to Pacific Mutual Life Insurance company for a store at 440 N. Capitol st. in the new Capitol shopping center. William M. Hamilton of Pacific Mutual said the store would be managed by W. L. Allen of the Moderne shop.

Pacific Greyhound bus lines obtained a \$2,000 permit to pave a parking lot next to the bus depot on 450 N. Church st., and O. M. Engdahl secured a \$4,000 permit to build a store at 1782 Fairgrounds rd.

Three permits for new dwellings were issued to Jack Henningsen, 3315 Willamette dr., \$13,000; A. J. Arehart, 455 N. Summer st., \$10,700; and Ned McCoy, 1470 N. 23rd st., \$13,200. A permit to erect a drive-in restaurant at 860 N. High st., was issued Wednesday to the Pacific Guaranty company. The restaurant will be managed by Roland and Evelyn Nohlgren, who announced Wednesday they will discontinue operation next year of their restaurant at Silver Falls lodge in Silver Falls park.

RCA Reveals Way to Add Color to Video

NEW YORK, Aug. 25—(AP)—A method for adding color to television without disturbing the present black and white system was disclosed today by the Radio Corporation of America.

In its announcement here, RCA made these claims for its system:

1. Existing sets, without any converter or adapter, could receive color telecasts in black or white or monochrome.

2. Color receivers, or present type sets equipped with adapters, could tune in both color and black and white telecasts.

3. Stations could use present transmitters to send in color with the addition of a small amount of equipment. A station could send some of its programs in color, for the benefit of owners of color sets, and some in black and white. Owners of present type sets not equipped for color would not notice the difference in the telecasts, and would see both types as black and white.

House Passes Compromise Housing Bill

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25—(AP)—Reversing itself, the house today killed an anti-segregation amendment, and then passed a bill providing \$3,750,000 additional mortgage insurance to aid home building by modest income families.

The measure the chamber approved overwhelmingly was a compromise that struck out, not only the civil rights clause, but also \$300,000,000 in direct housing loans for veterans.

Then, in a double-barreled move, intended to assure no let-up in the 1,000,000-plus a year rate of home construction, the house approved a separate "stop-gap" housing bill. This is for the senate to act upon in case that body hasn't time now to consider the big bill embracing the long-term program.

Grand Ronde Schools To Open September 12

GRAND RONDE, Aug. 25—(Special)—School will open here September 12 it was reported today. It is expected that nearly 200 pupils will attend the public school and the other operated by the Catholic sisters. Both are grade schools.

Fire Fighter's Body Found

MCCALL, Idaho, Aug. 25—(AP)—The charred body of Chester A. Johnson, Portland, Ore., was found in the smoldering Payette national forest today as two uncontrolled blazes roared through 20,000 acres of timber.

Joe Hessel, public relations officer for the U. S. forest service, said Johnson had been missing since last Sunday when the Warm Springs fire blew up.

Meanwhile, fires in 7,400-foot deep Hell's canyon and on the south fork of the Salmon river were raging out of control, Hessel declared.

He estimated that the south fork fire had now swept more than 12,000 acres and the Hell's canyon blaze has charred some 8,000 acres.

Salem Lions Hear Libby

Health programs are important to farmers as a means of pointing the way a needed job can be done, it was asserted in Salem Thursday by Harley Libby, Jefferson farmer and president of the Oregon Farmers Union Health association.

Libby said in a talk before Salem Lions club that preventive medicine through health education is stressed by the association.

In general farmers require improved health programs because of their way of life — more exposure, annual and uncertain income, less preventive health available and, often remoteness from a doctor.
