

Stock Market Drops Sharply

NEW YORK, Aug. 29—(P)—The stock market dropped back substantially today in a continuation of its retreat from the high point of the mid-summer rally.

Prices were lower by fractions more than a point among leaders. Oils, rails, and motors were in the forefront of the slide, but there wasn't a single major group escaping losses.

There was a marked contraction in the volume of trading. Total for the day was 640,000 shares, lowest since July 29.

Altogether there were 935 individual issues traded of which 178 advanced and 530 declined. On the downside six new lows were reached.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell .6 of a point to 63.5, taking it back to the level of the first week in August. The market advanced nine straight weeks from the start of the rally in mid-June, but last week it suffered its first week-to-week loss during the rally. The peak was Aug. 18.

Today the industrial component of the average was down 7.74 points, rate lost 4 and utilities were down 2.4 of a point.
