

Albany School Enrollment Sets Record

ALBANY—Enrollment in Albany schools at the close of the second day of school totaled 2,117. This is 57 more than the figure recorded a year ago, according to Arthur Palmer, curriculum coordinator.

The enrollment in the six lower grades is 1,004 as compared to 996 at the end of the first week in 1948. In the junior high an increase of 49 is noted, a total of 549 being registered to date.

Enrollment by grades: First, 213; second, 163; third, 159; fourth, 159; fifth, 169; sixth, 151; seventh, 158; eighth, 153; ninth, 238; tenth, 221; eleventh, 157; and twelfth, 174.

Double shifts are being made in the first grades at the Madison and Maple schools until the new Waverly school and the Liberty schools are completed.

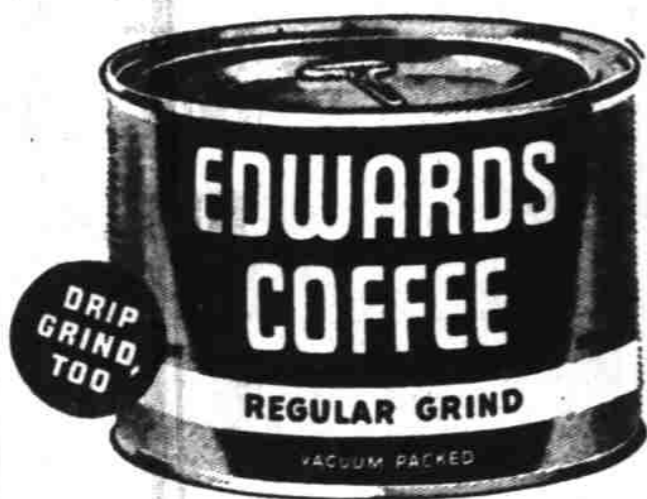
