

Postman Jones Finds Little Dog Problems

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP)—Postman Johnny Jones, who has been carrying the mail 14 years, has a few observations on dogs: "I have no trouble with big ones. People are just scared of their size. It's the little ones that are yappiest and which will chase you."

"Ninety per cent of the dogs I've met are friendly; the others are the reserved type, not necessarily mean, but stand-offish. First thing I do when I meet a new dog is whistle and talk to him in a friendly voice. The thing to do is be friendly, but don't push it."

"If you're riding a bicycle, remember it's the bike the dog is barking at. Get off and walk until the animal gets to know you. Never act afraid; don't threaten a dog. Don't pick up a stick because you may trouble him into attacking you. Strangles with dogs are mostly caused by humans anyway. Handle a dog right and he'll respond in a friendly way."

Two Texas Firms Build New Town Larger Than Life, But Not as Natural

WHITE ROCK, N.M. (AP)—Finishing touches have been put on a complete city built by two Texas firms. Winfield Morten, Dallas real estate developer, and Dallas and Estes, Dallas contracting firm, built in less than eight months the suburb to the Los Alamos atomic energy project community.

White Rock houses 3,112 persons and was constructed at a cost of \$3,591,494. It was conceived a year ago to provide living quarters for skilled construction workers at Los Alamos.

MALVERN, Australia (AP)—Alan Campbell Drury, radio operator and official photographer with the Australian Antarctic Expedition, after 12 months' duty on Heard Island, returned with a stuffed baby penguin a foot high.

Some time after his return the creature had grown six inches, yet had been dead several months. It had been stuffed with glass wool—as used by the expedition to insulate huts. Fred Jacka, cosmic ray scientist with the expedition, stuffed an adult penguin on Heard Island, brought it home, and it grew 12 inches. No explanation of the change has been made.

MANILA, Thursday, Sept. 15 (AP)—Telephone cable thieves today isolated headquarters of the Philippines national defense forces and the University of the Philippines in outlying Quezon City. Communications Director Felipe Cuaderno asked more police protection for government lines.

QUAKE TOLL STILL RISING
QUITO, Ecuador, Sept. 15 (AP)—The government has added 500 persons to its estimates of the number killed in the August 5 earthquake and it was feared the final total might reach as high as 8,000 dead.

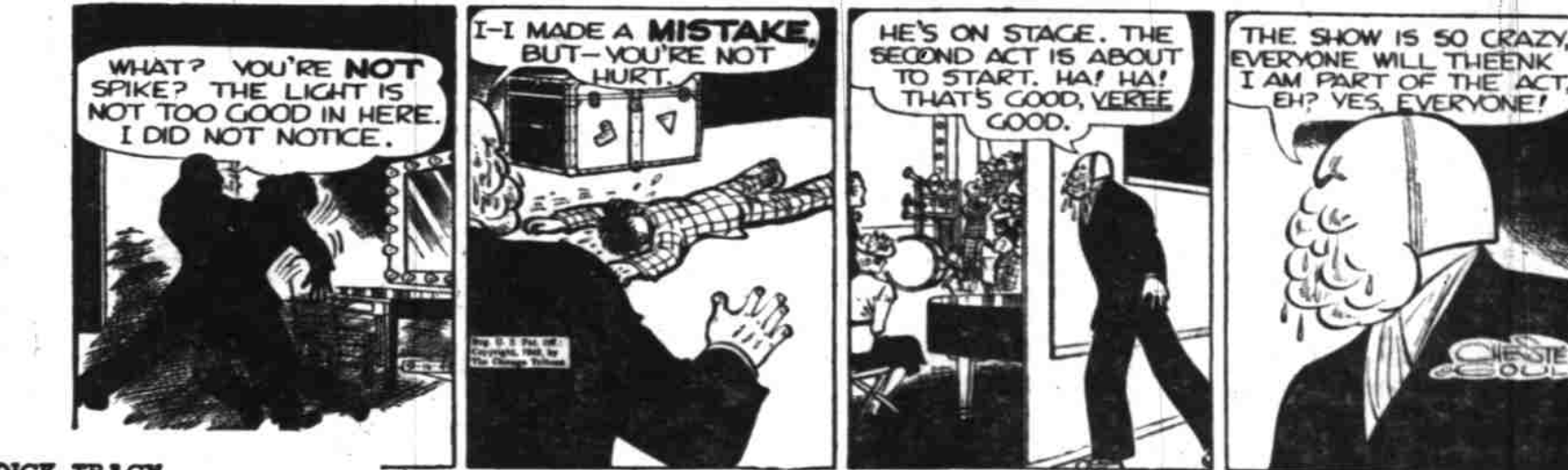
