

Nation's Top Women Swingers To Vie in National Open Meet

Greatest Field Awaits Start

Zaharias, Jameson, Berg Given Chance

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—The greatest field of golfing gals ever assembled is slated to compete when play opens Thursday for the fourth annual women's national open crown at Prince Georges Country club.

Every major United States and British pro and amateur women's champion is scheduled to shoot for the nation's top female crown.

Although only 55 women are expected to tee off over the 6892-yard, par-75 Landover, Md. course, every entrant in the \$7,500, 72-hole medal play affair is a definite title threat.

Leading the list from the pro ranks are three former open titleholders—Defending Champ Babe Dridrickson Zaharias of Grossinger, N. Y., the 1947 winner Betty Jameson from Chicago, and 1946 queen Patty Berg who also now hails from the windy city.

National Amateur Champion Dorothy Germain Porter of Philadelphia and the three other semi-finalists in the recent Quaker City meet—Dot Kieley of Long Beach, Calif., Dot Kirby of Atlanta and 15-year-old Mariene Bauer from Los Angeles—top the amateur entry.

Patty Berg, who is president of the newly formed ladies' PGA which is sponsoring the event has expressed the sentiment of nearly all the campaigners.

"There's never been a field like this in women's golf history," she said. "The winner will really be the first true American women's champion and I sure hope I win."

'Cats Continue CWCE Drills

Vowing to hit the win column after being very much in the lost department last weekend against Idaho, Willamette's Bearcats hustled through more drills Tuesday afternoon in preparation for Friday night's clash against Central Washington College at Ellensburg.

Coach Chester Stackhouse continued to work at ironing out the rough spots which cropped up during the Vandal touchdown parade. With the squad in good physical shape, Stackhouse feels his lads will be in a position to go all-out against the CWCE's. The Ellensburg club was steam-rolled by Portland university, 32-0, in its first start but Stackhouse is emphasizing to his crew that it could well have been Portland strength rather than glaring CWCE weakness which produced the lop-sided Pilot win. The Bearcats won't be taking the Ellensburg too lightly when they travel north.

Substantial workouts are set for the 'Cats today, with tapering drills on tap for Thursday.

Northwest Conference Teams Did OK in 1949 Commencers

A highly respectable three wins, one tie, and one loss was the record for the Pacific Northwest conference in opening clashes last week-end. College of Idaho, defending conference champion, lowered the boom on Southern Idaho 31 to 6 at Caldwell Saturday night to indicate that they won't abdicate their throne without a struggle. Lewis & Clark stamped themselves as a real permanent threat when they romped over Western Washington 19 to 0 at Bellingham. Bob Pollard, all-conference basketball star, filled the questionable quarterback slot for the Pioneers in more than satisfactory manner.

Third win by a conference team was posted by Linfield in an impressive manner. Coach Paul Duram's charges ran up a 49 to 0 victory over Eastern Oregon College of Education at La Grande. For the first half of the game, it appeared that Pacific would score a second triumph for the Northwest conference over their Winko league foes. But after leading 20 to 0, the Badgers had to settle for a 20-20 tie with Pacific Lutheran at Forest Grove Saturday night.

Both Willamette and the conference would just as soon forget the unpleasantness at Moscow last Saturday afternoon. After Idaho's 79 to 0 thumping, the Bearcats are willing to concede that Dixie Howell has one of the strongest teams in Idaho history.

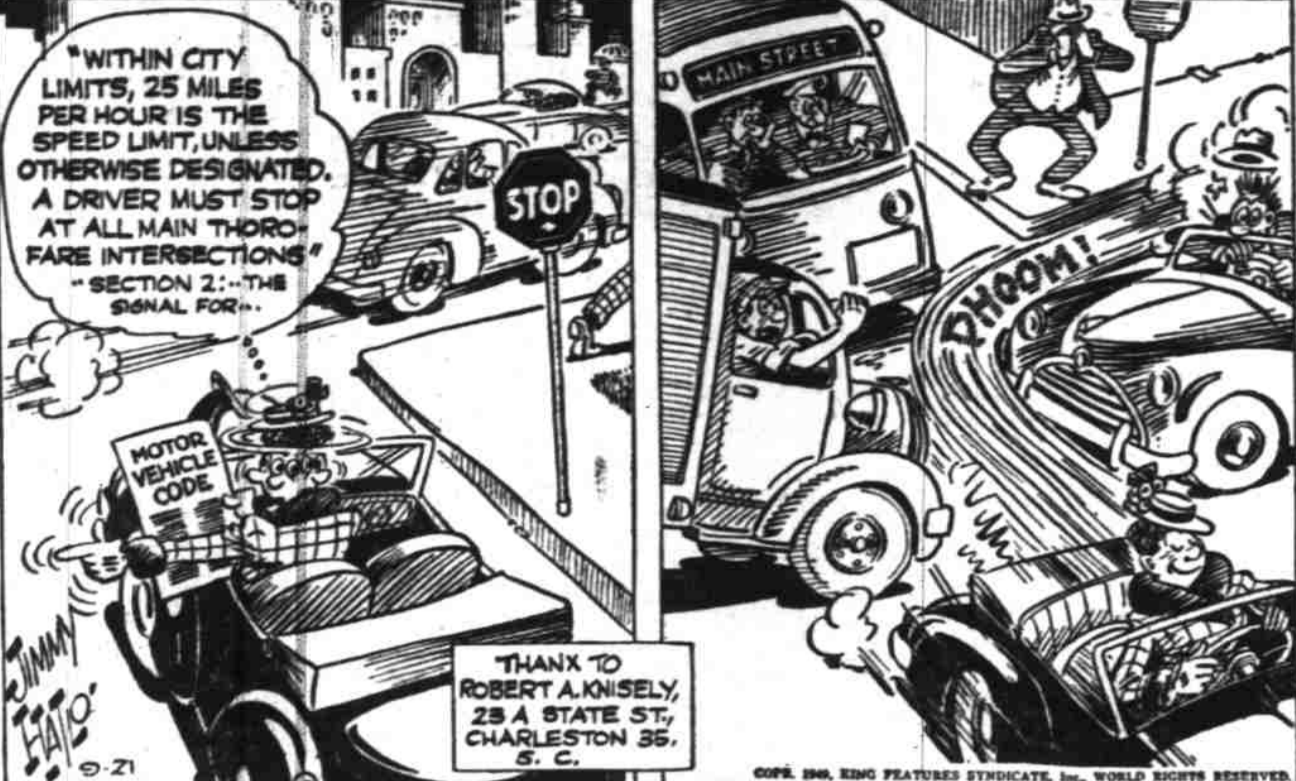

Beavers Eye Comeback Palmer Wins In Utah Game Saturday British Start

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Sept. 20—Oregon State's football team will attempt to make a comeback from its disappointing 35-13 loss to UCLA in its opener last weekend at Los Angeles when the Beavers travel to Salt Lake for an inter-sectional clash with highly regarded Utah Saturday night.

Although the Redskin clash is a non-conference affair, both clubs will go all out to win as leadership in the inter-league series is at stake. Each school has won once, and last year's meeting resulted in a thrilling 20-20 deadlock. Two years ago at Salt Lake an underdog Utah eleven upset the Orange, 7-6.

The Beavers came through their dismal showing against the Bruins without serious injury and should be in good physical condition for the Rocky Mountain invasion. Veteran center Al Gray, who was kicked in the head on the opening kickoff of the UCLA encounter and did not see further action, is fully recovered. Halfback Dick Gray received a hip bruise, but should be OK by Saturday.

Coach Kip Taylor, whose debut in the coast conference was spoiled by the Bruins, had no alibis to offer, simply saying UCLA outplayed his club. The Uclan out-blocked and out-tackled the Beavers and used their speed to great advantage.

Despite the loss, Taylor plans no drastic changes in the lineup. But the Beavers' new grid chief figures the best remedy for his squad is more hard work on fundamentals, and has been sending his men through long all-afternoon workouts this week.

Cincinnati Manager Bucky Walters was named the National League's most valuable player in 1939 when he won 27 games for the pennant-winning Reds.

TADWORTH, Eng., Sept. 20 (AP)—Johnny Palmer of Badin, N. C., started his revenge campaign for his Ryder Cup defeats today by ousting Bert Williamson of England in a first-round match of the British Professional Golfers' association championships. The score was 3 and 1.

The seven other Americans entered in the five-day tournament over the 6,740-yard old course at Walton Heath drew first round byes and won't see action until tomorrow.
