## Credit Meet Scheduled for Salem Soon

Several hundred retail credit managers, employees and officers in credit bureaus will be in Salem next Saturday and Sunday to attend the annual Oregon Columbia regional credit conference.

Up for discussion at the meeting in the Marion hotel will be methods of combatting the increased delinquency in credit, sales promotion and controlling present credit and seeking new credit volume.

Credit bureau managers from Oregon and southwestern Washington will conduct an all-day meeting Saturday. Approximately 30 are expected to attend.

A general session for retail credit managers and employees with speakers will be held Sunday morning. Group meetings will be Sunday afternoon.

The meetings will include such topics as open accounts, installment and budget sales, fuels and petroleum, medical-dental-hospital, utilities, automotive service and repairs and building materials.

Included among the credit officers present will be Richard T. Schatz of Spokane, Wash., national retail credit president. Mrs. Alta Myers of Salem is attending chairman and Francis Smith of Salem Credit bureau is arranging speakers for the Sunday morning program.

Hosts will be Salem Credit association, Salem Credit Women's Breakfast club and the Associated Credit Bureaus.

## Specialist in Structure, Action Of Proteins Teaches at WU

A specialist in the structure and behavior of proteins is the latest addition to Willamette university's chemistry department. He is Dr. James C. Nichols, associate professor, who is the third full-time instructor for the 150 students who are enrolled in chemistry courses this year.

The 27-year-old native of Canada has degrees from University of Alberta in Edmonton and from University of Wisconsin, where he studied under an Eli Lilly scholarship.

### Written Articles

Nichols has studied in great detail what happens to proteins in blood serums and has contributed several articles on that subject to the Journal of the American Chemical society. In March, 1949, Dr. Nichols presented a paper to the society meeting in San Francisco. The young professor hasn't decided yet whether he will become an American citizen. Besides his wife, the family consists of a 3-month-old son. During the war Nichols worked for the Canadian government, helping on the "synthesis of organic compounds project."

Some Advanced Students  
Of the 150 Willamette students in chemistry courses two-thirds will take only one year of chemistry while the remaining 50 will study more advanced courses, according to faculty members. One of the larger groups of advanced students is the pre-med. Willamette's reputation in the medical schools of the state is held to be excellent judging from the ready acceptance of most students. Dr. Charles H. Johnson, head of the chemistry department, has taught here since 1928. Prof. Floyd W. Bird, a graduate of Linfield college and Oregon State college, joined the department in 1946.

## Area Asks to Quit Proposed Fire District

A third group asked Saturday to be eliminated from the proposed organization of the Salem Heights-Liberty rural fire protection district.

They are 28 property owners residing in an area bounded by the Pacific highway, Madrona avenue, Liberty road and Salem Heights avenue. They petitioned Marion county court Saturday to be allowed to withdraw.

They had previously signed petitions asking for organization of the fire district. Since then they have become 100 per cent against the district for they have no desire to bopd their homes to protect some property interests who are trying to force it upon them.

The sponsors of the Liberty-Salem Heights fire district, they said, "get the property owners to sign their petitions, misrepresented by telling them it was all to be done by contribution and not by taxation."

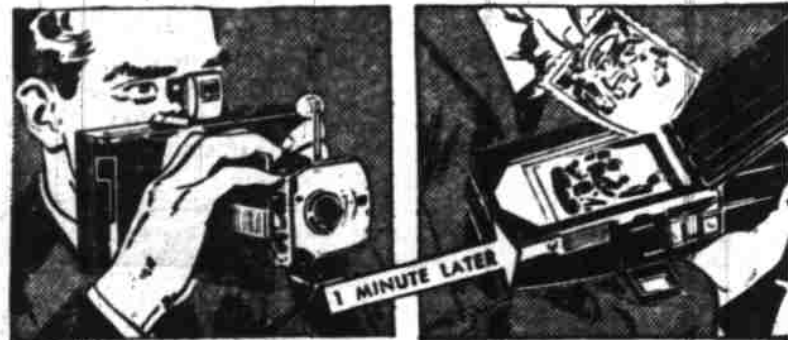
