Mayor Lee Asks Change in Court System

PORTLAND, Oct. 20 (AP)—Mayor Dorothy McCullough Lee proposed today that a parole officer, independent of municipal judges, be assigned to municipal court cases.

She introduced an ordinance which would make the city council responsible for reviewing or reversing decisions of the parole officer. The ordinance would also require full court records.

The municipal judges expressed disapproval of the ordinance. They said that divorcing the parole officer from them would hamper their work.

The mayor had appealed for a regular parole system in the city, after several prisoners reported that they had paid a Savies Island farmer to get them out of jail.

Miss Rader Talks to PTA

The "school of tomorrow" was discussed by Miss Elizabeth Rader, state elementary school director, at the Englewood school's first PTA meeting of the season this week.

Miss Rader stressed the importance of discarding outmoded equipment and methods and predicted that schools of the future would seem almost fantastic when compared with those of today.

The first PTA gathering attracted a large turnout of parents. Music was furnished by Mrs. Wayne Meusey, who presented vocal and piano numbers and refreshments were served by the 5th and 6th grade mothers.

BLAZE IN OAKS PARK
PORTLAND, Oct. 20 (AP)—A fire partly destroyed a wooden warehouse at the Oaks Amusement park today, and damaged several thousand dollars worth of skating costumes and other supplies. Firemen kept the blaze from spreading to the skating rink and other buildings.

Diphtheria Case Fatal

MEDFORD, Oct. 20 (AP)—A 12-year-old boy died of diphtheria here last night, bringing to three the number of fatalities from that disease here.

An encouraging note arose, however, with the report that no new cases have turned up. By now, virtually every school child in the county has been inoculated against the disease.

Eleven cases have occurred, three of them ending in death.

Stock Market Finishes on Losing Side

NEW YORK, Oct. 20 (AP)—The stock market ran into tax troubles today and finished on the losing side.

Losses were small for the most part and a substantial number of issues crept a little higher.

In early dealings the market showed signs of getting ahead. In mid-morning, though, President Truman, speaking at a press conference, indicated he would force to ask congress for higher taxes when the legislators reconvene in January. Demand flagged immediately.

For most of the balance of the session quotations were persistently shaded. Turnover was most active when rallying signs were in evidence. Business for the day, swollen by numerous big blocks which sold in the morning, contracted to 1,270,000 shares from 1,370,000 Wednesday.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dipped .2 of one point to 87.1.

Official Dims Bridge Hopes

PENDLETON, Oct. 20 (AP)—A discouraging note for the interests who want a bridge across the Columbia river at Umatilla was sounded here today.

Charles H. Reynolds, LaGrande, who talked with the federal bureau of public roads chief about it, said the latter did not approve the bridge. He felt it would use federal money needed more urgently elsewhere.

Reynolds said he didn't think the states could finance it, either.
