

Razed House Discloses Old Statesmans

Long-covered copies of The Oregon Statesman and Harper's Weekly, all more than 80 years old, were found Thursday on the walls of a house being razed at 632 N. Liberty st., to make room for the new Herrall-Owens used car lot.

The papers apparently had been covered by other wall material years ago. Still - readable portions of The Statesman dated 1864 told of the paper's plan to start daily publication on July 20 of that year, because of the "public greed for news." Other papers told of Sherman's Civil war campaign.

The property is now owned by R. J. Herrall. An adjoining property, owned by B. E. Owens, also is to be cleared as part of the used car lot. Herrall and Owens are owners of the Salem Pontiac dealership, and moved into their new garage next to the two houses 18 months ago.

Buyers Warned to Stay Away from 'Special Discounts'

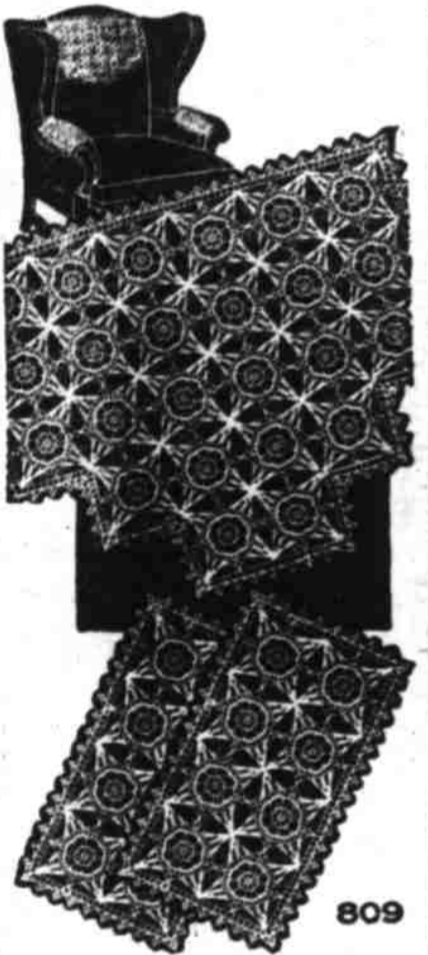
CLEVELAND (INS)—People who do business with the "I can get it for you wholesale" operator are as bad off as an infant who plays with matches.

The horse, Lady O' War, and her colt are owned by Jim Hall, member of the Salem fire department, who will give the series of exhibition jumps, at 10:30 this morning at the school for the deaf and at 1:15 this afternoon at the school for the blind.

Hall said the horse had performed at several other state institutions. He returned over the week end from the Pacific International Livestock Exposition at Portland, where the horse won first in the northwest division jumpers' stake.

Boy Becomes Dam Nuisance To His Family

CLEVELAND (INS)—It took some time, but 14-year-old Arden Stahl moved Colorado's Hoover dam into the kitchen of his parents' Cleveland apartment.

Young Stahl, son of an engineer, moved a concrete-and-wood mold into the kitchen piece by piece, and drove his family, meal by meal, into the living room as the work progressed.

Now the 150-pound dam—four feet long, two feet wide and a foot and a half high—jams the tiny breakfast nook as it pumps water by a one-third horsepower electric motor.

Stahl started the dam—complete with the Colorado river—for a high school science course, and ended up with an A.

Constructed on a one-inch-to-80-foot scale, the dam now has Arden fixing the plumbing in the rest of the apartment, and has given him two ambitions—to become a construction engineer and to see the real Hoover dam. He built his from encyclopedia pictures.

Do Hens Enjoy Laying Eggs? --Obviously!

ITHACA (INS)—Does a chicken lay eggs because she wants to or because she has to?

Prof. L. E. Weaver of the Cornell university poultry department says the answer to both questions is "yes." He says:

"Obviously a pullet enjoys laying. She sings happily, expectantly when she enters the nest. She cackles hilariously after the performance is over.

"In a very real way a pullet is an egg-making factory. When she reaches maturity the factory is ready to begin operations. All the machinery is in place and ready to go. The key that unlocks the door, pulls the switch, and puts the machine in motion is light, either daylight or artificial light.

"Give a pullet plenty of modern laying ration, good care, and 14 hours of light each day, and she will have to lay, in spite of any will of her own to the contrary."

Not all hens need the same amount of light, the professor adds. Some will keep on laying with only a 10-hour day. Some require 13 hours, a few even more, so the usual practice is to allow at least 14 hours. Extra light does not harm the layers even when the lights are left on all night.
