New Device Aims to Quiet Barking Dogs

MINNEAPOLIS (INS)— Electronics is doing everything these days from bringing you television to keeping dogs from barking. When W. J. McGoldrick, head of the engineering department of Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Company, had trouble with his dog yapping before sun-up, he solved the problem by electronics. He put together a microphone, an electronic amplifier from an automatic home heating control system, a heating plant valve and a nozzle from an oil burner. All of this was rigged up with the city water supply and installed in the doghouse with the microphone at muzzle height. Now when the pet barks to get out of his quarters, the microphone sends the sound to the amplifier; the amplifier boosts the signal and sends it to the valve; the valve opens and whish!—the dog gets a squirt of water in the face.

Gardening Today

Because I shall be gone on a two weeks vacation the next two weeks, I'll try to clear up a number of the questions which have been piling up on my desk. A number of them were duplicates and I hope you will all be able to understand the information which belongs to you. Daffodil bulbs may still be planted in the garden. They do comparatively well if planted on any nice day throughout November. Even tulips may go into the ground throughout November if you do not have them in before. Roses should be set out while dormant unless bought in containers from which they may be planted at anytime during the year. Whenever possible I like to set my new roses out in late November, just around Thanksgiving time. There are a number of nice

new varieties to try out this year. Peonies, which should have been divided and reset in September, may still be cared for. But do not divide into too small parts. Sections of roots with three to five eyes each make blooming-sized, bushy plants. Remove all diseased roots carefully and clean. Planting Strawberries The best time to plant or replant the everbearing strawberries is in early spring. Many growers recommend fall, and they will get a head start—provided the winter is mild. Take runner plants and discard old ones, especially if the old ones are two or three years old. Plants should be set with crown on the ground level and about two feet apart. Rows are usually placed three feet apart. The winter strapberries are affected with blackspot and if they are planted near the rose bed, the roses frequently suffer more than do the roses. Foliage will all fall from the apples. This should be gathered up and burned and the tree should be sprayed as the rose bushes are for control of blackspot. As perennials begin to die down, cut off the tops and remove, either putting them on the compost heap or burning. If the garden has been kept quite disease-free, composting the perennial plants is a rather good idea. Winter rye (two pounds per 100 square feet) is a good green manure for the vegetable plot. Sow soon as the ground is cleared and spade under next spring. Feeding the rye with a balanced fertilizer this fall is not a bad idea. You will not lose the nutrients but store them for next spring's growth. A good oak with colorful foliage in autumn is the scarlet oak, although the red oak and the pine oak also make good nice lawn trees where a fair-sized tree can be used. Lift the tuberous begonias after the first frost. Cut the stalk down to about five inches. Wash carefully and put them in the basement to dry. When the tubers are dry, pack them in layers in a flat, cover them with peat moss between each layer and on top, and place them in the basement where the temperatures never get down to freezing and do not get much above 50 degrees during the winter. If the African violets are leggy, divide and report, covering the bare stems with a good soil mixture.

NOGALES, Ariz., Oct. 22 (AP)—Reports received here indicate that a meteor fell last Sunday afternoon in the vicinity of Tres Boletos, Sonora, Mex. The town is about 20 miles southwest of Nogales across the border from Ruby, Ariz. Impact of the fall was felt within a radius of 100 miles, according to reports to the Nogals office. Witnesses said they saw a ball of blue-green fire crash to earth in the vicinity of Tres Boletos.

Plan to Dissolve Multnomah Police Meets Opposition

PORTLAND, Oct. 22 (AP)—The Multnomah county tax commission today rejected a proposal that the sheriff's office police work be turned over to the state police. The idea of eliminating county police forces in favor of state officers had come from the late legislature. Multnomah Tax Commission Chairman M. L. Bingham today released a 3,200 word report on tax supervising and conservation proposals. The report said "local control of police authority is extremely important because abuses of power and authority and otherwise poor police service, if existent, can be much more easily corrected at the local level than at the state level."

NEW YORK, Oct. 22 (AP)—Canadian and U. S. "weekend flyers" today staged a mock air attack and defense of New York City. The maneuver, known as "operation metropolis," earlier had been threatened with postponement when the Canadian planes were forced down at Albany, N. Y., by heavy winds. The planes took off later, however, and arrived in time to start the maneuver on schedule. Twenty planes of the New York and New Jersey national air guard took part in the maneuver, including twelve B-26 bombers and eight F-47 fighter craft. The Canadian air reservists used eight Vampire jet fighters.

Paraplegics Ask No Favors

LOS ANGELES (AP)— UCLA's 59 paraplegic students ask no favors, and get none. They do all right without help. Paralyzed below the waist, they navigate in wheel chairs. But to the rest of the campus they are just fellow students—and good ones. In four years, wheel chair students at UCLA have increased from two to the present 59. Forty-eight are veterans. Five of the non-vets are women. They registered for classes this year just like the rest of the scholars. They sit in the same classes, get the same assignments as anybody else. They major in such varied subjects as physics, psychology, law, business administration, economics and music. Last year three of them received straight "A's". The university's office of veterans affairs, which looks after the rolling brigade, recently disclosed that the group has a higher grade average than the 4000 veterans on campus. The vets, in turn, are better students than the other undergraduates.

Fire Truck Chases Train to Put Out Blaze on Boxcar

ROCKY FORD, Colo. (AP)— A freight train whizzed through town recently with one of its stock cars ablaze. Fire Chief Clyde Summers hopped into the town fire truck with several helpers and pursued the fleeing blaze for a number of miles.
