

Cal Writers Praise Celeri

Scribes to Support Ace for All-America

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 31.—(AP)—Members of the Northern California Football Writers' association voted today to support University of California Quarterback Bob Celeri as a candidate for All-America honors.

The decision was made following Celeri's spectacular performance last Saturday in which he led his team to a 35-21 victory over the University of California at Los Angeles.

Al Weston, secretary of the Southern California Football Writers' association, telephoned that his group had also voted to back Celeri.

The 21-year-old Bear senior thus supplanted the College of Pacific's Eddie Le Baron and the University of San Francisco's Willie Matson as the local organization's top candidate for honors.

Two weeks ago, the local writers voted to support the latter two backs for All-America recognition. At that time, there was one dissenting vote (the writer's).

Celeri's great show against UCLA accounted for three new individual California football records. His 12 completed passes set a new mark for a single game by a California man. He also set records of 214 and the most yards in total offense of 225.

The Bear quarterback has already surpassed the seasonal record for a California player by passes with 753 yards and he still has three games to play. He leads the Coast conference in total offense with 929 yards.

Bill Leiser, San Francisco Chronicle sports editor, described Celeri as "the greatest collegiate quarterback in the country without a doubt."

California Coach Lynn (Pappy) Waldorf, who coached the great Otto Graham at Northwestern, compared Celeri on at least even terms.

In another action, however, the writers voted the first annual Glenn (Pop) Warner award to an outstanding player in Pacific coast football to LeBaron. The award is sponsored by the Live Oaks Sports organization of Palo Alto, Calif.

Waldorf said the Bears respect Washington State, which they meet next Saturday. The statement brought broad smiles. California is the only undefeated team in the Pacific Coast conference. Washington State last Saturday lost to Oregon State, 35-6.

Asked to compare UCLA and USC, Waldorf said UCLA had the stronger ground attack and USC was far superior in passing.

California beat USC two weeks ago 16-10. He praised Ernie Johnson UCLA left half, and Jim Powers, UCLA quarterback. Pappy said Johnson was just as hard to bring down as Celeri.

Pair Wounded, Hunt Accidents

PENDLETON, Ore., Oct. 31.—(AP)—Two men were wounded in hunting accidents in Umatilla county yesterday. One was killed.

Colonel Thompson, 28, of Umatilla, was shot through both legs with a rifle bullet by an elk hunter. Sheriff Bob Goard said Frederick John Combe, 28, Portland, fired the shot.

Coombe, a marine corps sergeant stationed at Swan island, was charged with firing into brush without seeing his target.

Robert Leon Price, 30, Hermiston, was shot in the upper arm with a shotgun that exploded as he was handing the piece out of his automobile window.

The 1949 American League flag won by the New York Yankees was the 16th captured by the team.

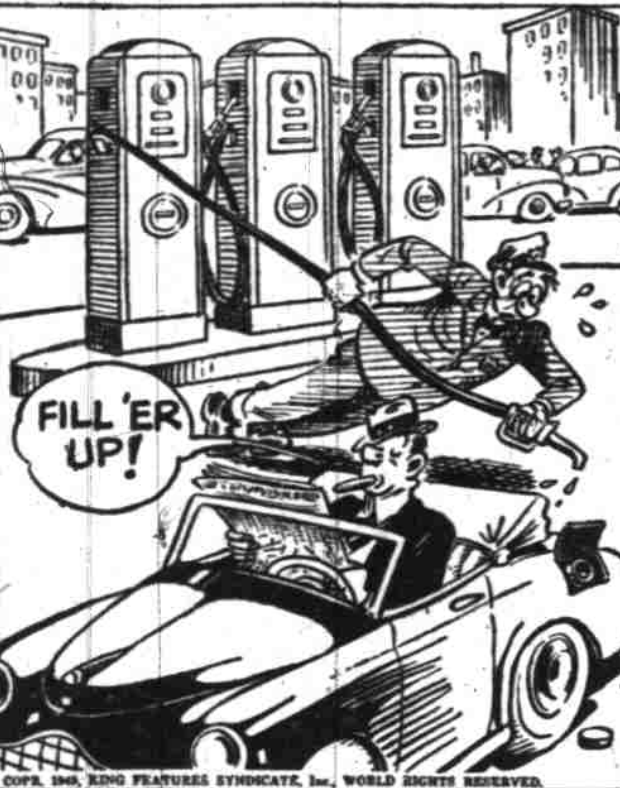

Sullivan-Jennings Go at Raiders Next For OCE '11'

A pair of Irishmen, John L. Sullivan of Portland and Johnny Jennings of Boise, Ida., get together Wednesday night at the armory in the main event bout on Matchmaker Tex Salkeld's 28-round fistic show. The two lightweights will meet in a 10-rounder. It will be Jennings' first appearance in the Salem ring.

A six-rounder featuring the veteran Portlander Al Cliff and the wild-swinging Lou Nunes will be a rematch between this pair. The stocky Los Angeles bull, a wow on every card in which he appears, recently defeated Davey Ball in a Eugene brawl, but has been licked by Cliff. The Portlander knocked out Nunes in their first fight in what was considered quite an upset. So it will be revenge the Los Angeles seeks in the Wednesday scrap.

One of the show's three four-rounders has been signed also. In it featherweights Jimmy Ogden, Portland, and Larry Reagan, Hermiston, will go at it. The other two prelims, first of which starts the show at 8:30 o'clock, will be announced tomorrow by Salkeld.

Larry Caputo, manager of Jennings and onetime handler of Sullivan, predicts that the Boise battler, who has had 75 professional bouts, will not only beat the handsome Sullivan, but will knock him out. In Sullivan's last Salem appearance he did some kayoing of his own. In seven rounds over King Henry Lee of Seattle.

Alexander Fan Finds Self Treating 'Pete'

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 31.—(AP)—The doctor who treated Grover Cleveland Alexander for a mild stroke turned out to be a baseball fan who used to watch a Pete pitch for the St. Louis Cardinals nearly a quarter century ago.

Alexander went out for breakfast yesterday and collapsed in a drug store. An ambulance took him to Hollywood receiving hospital.

Dr. Kearney Sauer found himself talking more about baseball with Alexander than about "Pete's" ailment. Alexander, 42, stayed in the hospital a couple of hours, then returned to his home.

"I told Alexander that more than once I watched him pitch for the Cards in 1926," Dr. Sauer said.

Seals Drew 435,000 In 11-Game Jap Tour

TOKYO, Oct. 31.—(AP)—The San Francisco Seals headed for home today after an exhibition tour in which they drew an estimated 435,000 spectators in only eleven games.

This was only 12,000 less than they attracted in all of their home games during the regular Coast league season. Seals attendance in their 85 home games was 447,000, the club finishing a bad seventh in the league. They won all but one of their games in Japan, losing to the Far East Air Forces team.
