

Cameron Holds WIL Bat Title

New Records Made In 1949 Campaign

Clint Cameron, Wenatchee first baseman-outfielder won the 1949 batting title for the Western Inter-national league with a mark of .380, according to official figures released today by the Howe News bureau, league statisticians. Cameron played in 111 games. Vancouver Manager-Catcher Bill Brenner hit .363, but appeared in only 66 contests. Dick Sirovic of Vancouver (sold by Salem) in 89 games hit .368 for second place. Salem's leading hitter was Mel Wasley with .329. Dick Bartle wound up with .268, but in only 26 games.

Jim Robinson, Vancouver third baseman had the most hits, 221, and stole the most bases, 41. Jim Warner, Wenatchee outfielder grossed the most total bases, 344, and established a new league record with his 43 home runs. This wiped out the old mark of 40 by Bill Barstoff of Bremerton, made in 1946. Warner scored 152 runs to run up another record. Ralph Samhammer of Vancouver's 1940 team had tallied 151.

Victoria second-baseman Gil McDougald rapped out most dou-bles, 44, and Dick Myers of Wenatchee most triples, 17. Larry Barton of Spokane drove in most runs, 132, and teammate Ken Richardson drew the most walks, 135. Dick Greco of Tacoma struck out the most, 120 times. Vancouver set a league record with 179 double plays.

Several departmental records were established in the pitching table, the most important being that of Hank Anderson of Vancouver whose .917 percentage of wins exceeded the old mark of .887 by Don Osborn of Vancouver in 1941. John Marshall of Bremerton and Frank Logue of Victoria jointly hung up a new mark for most games pitched at 49 each. Marshall also wrote in a new record in innings pitched, 289, two more than the mark held by Floyd Be-kle of Tacoma in 1938. Ray For-telle of Tacoma set a record for runs allowed with 169, replacing the 178 total made by Elmer Sing-leton of Wenatchee in 1940. Vancouver won the team bat-ting title with a .268 mark. Salem was last at .263. Vancouver also was top fielding team with .964. Salem was sixth with .961.

A happy crew after their best showing of the season in trim-ming Astoria last Friday night, Salem high's Vikings got down to work Monday for Friday's night's crucial Big Six league fracas against Eugene's Axemen on the enemy grid. The tilt will be the local's final one of the regular season.

Currently tied with the Axemen, Corvallis and Albany for the Big Six lead, the Vikes can gain a tie for the title with the winner of the Albany-Corvallis tilt this weekend if they stop the Eugene gang. The winner will also be in the thick of contention for district honors. Aside from those stakes the tilt will be a renewal of the state's oldest prep athletic rivalry.

Several items were particularly pleasing to Coach Loren Mort as the Vikings ran over the Astorians. The pass combination of Gene Gerver-to-Doug Rogers clicked with deadly effectiveness against the Fishermen and that weapon can be used frequently against Eugene. And once again a big cut in the Vik attack was Captain Jim Rock. He added to his sparklers with a 96-yard touchdown jaunt in the Astoria game on the second-half kickoff. Fine interference by his mates helped Jim.

Mort will hurl his charges through scrimmage this after-noon.

The American League has won 29 World Series and the National League 17.

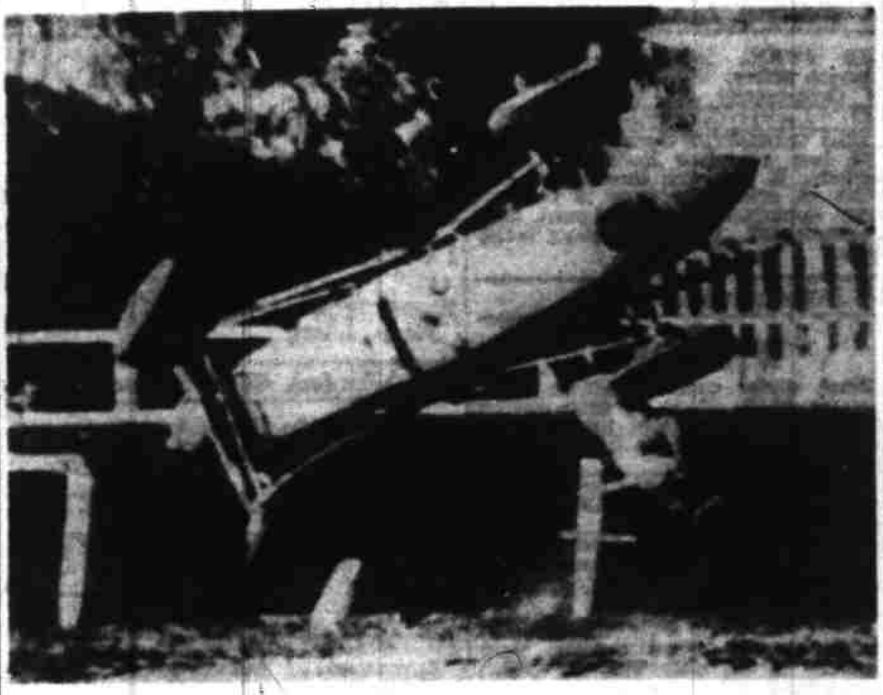
