Clint Cameron, Wenatchee first baseman-outfielder won the 1949 batting title for the Western Inter national league with a mark ter national league with a mark of .380, according to official figures released today by the Howe News bureau, league satisticians. Cameron played in 111 games. Vancouver Manager-Catcher Bill Brenner hit .383, but appeared in only 68 contests. Dick Sinovic of Vancouver (sold by Salem) in 89 games hit .368 for second place. Salem's leading hitter was Mel Wasley with .329. Dick Bartle Wasley with 329. Dick Bartle wound up with 365, but is only

Jim Robinson, Vancouver third baseman had the most hits, 221, and stole the most bases, 41. Jim Warner, Wen atchee outfielder grossed the most total bases, 344, and established a new league rec-ord with his 43 home runs. This wiped off the old mark of 40 by Bill Barisoff of Bremerton, made in 1946. Warner scored 152 runs o run up another record. Ralph Samhammer of Vancouver's 1940 team had tallied 151.

Victoria second-baseman Gil-McDougald rapped out most dou-bles, 44, and Dick Myers of Wen-atchee most triples, 17. Larry Bar-ton of Spokane drove in most runs, 132, and teammate Ken Richard-son drew the most walks, 135. Dick Greco of Tacoma struck out the most 126 times. Venecurer set a most, 120 times. Vancouver set a eague record with 179 double

Several departmental records were established in the pitching table, the most important being that of Hunk Anderson of Vancouver whose .917 percentage of wins discarded the old mark of .857 by Don Osborn of Vancouver in 1941. John Marshall of Bremerton and Frank Logue of Victoria jointly hung up a new mark for most games pitched at 49 each. Mar-shall also wrote in a new record in innings pitched, 289, two more than the mark held by Floyd Isekite of Tacoma in 1938. Ray Fortier of Tacoma set a record for runs allowed with 189, replacing the 178 total made by Elmer Singleton of Wenatchee in 1940.






