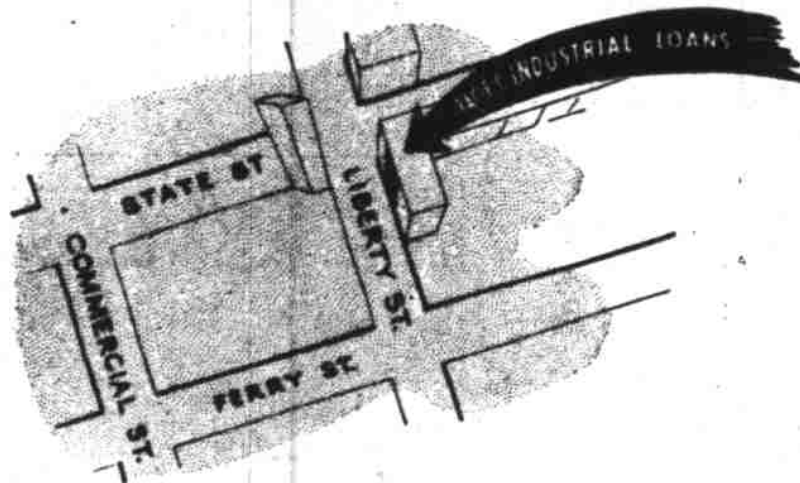

Services for C. E. Bowman Today, Canby

Funeral services for Charles Edward Bowman, 93, who came around Cape Horn to Oregon in 1862, will be at 2 o'clock this

afternoon in Canby. He died Friday morning at a Salem hospital after a week's illness. Burial will be at Zion Memorial cemetery, Canby.

Bowman's mother, widowed in Wisconsin, sailed for Oregon, where she had relatives. With her were her three small children, including Bowman and a sister, now Mrs. Caroline Hixson, 178 N. 25th st., with whom he had lived the past two years. The family settled on a place that is

now the site of the state penitentiary annex.

Bowman spent most of his life in Canby, where he was a carpenter. He also had resided at Molalla, where he was water commissioner.

Survivors are a daughter, Rita Crumley of Hillsboro, and a son, Charles Bowman of Forest Grove, and several great grandchildren.
