Mrs. D. L. Callier entertained her club at a dessert bridge Tuesday night at her country home.

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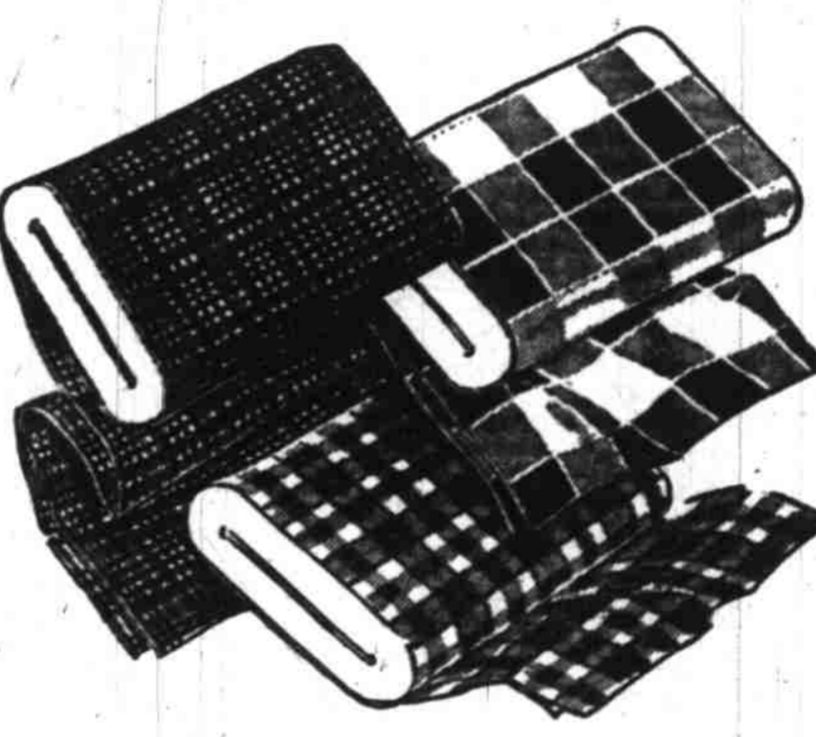


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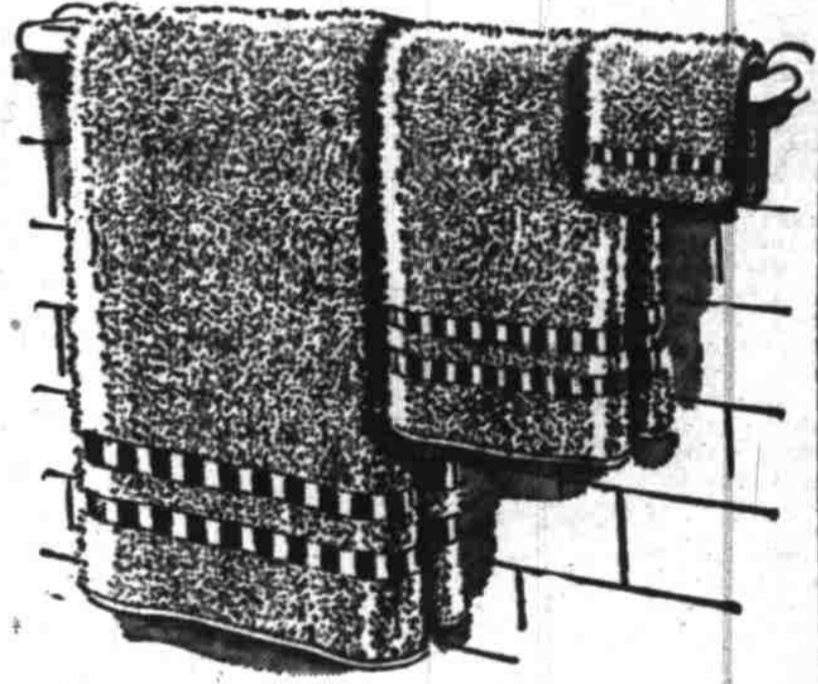
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
