Lutherans Note 50th Year for St. John's Here

Golden anniversary of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran church, affiliated with the Missouri synod, will be observed Sunday at the 11 a. m. service. The congregation in 50 years has had only three pastors, and the Rev. H. W. Gross has served since 1910, making him the dean of Salem ministers.

The service Sunday will be in remembrance of the church's "blessings and opportunities." Organized in November, 1899, with six voting members, the congregation erected its first building on Center street between 13th and 14th. Ten years later the structure was moved to 16th and A streets, where it still serves. A parsonage was built in 1912 and in 1915 a Christian day school which was discontinued in 1930.

The congregation now numbers some 350 baptized members, and two services are required each Sunday morning to accommodate them. A new \$150,000 church is being erected at 14th and Court streets.

Auxiliary organizations include the Lutheran Women's guild, Lutheran Laymen's league and the Walter League. Chairman of the congregation is William Lewis; trustees, A. Holscher, W. Jarms and B. Ratjig; elders, Carl Anderson, G. Brodhagen, Leroy Mitendorf and Edwin Sahnow; secretary, W. Sylvester; treasurer, W. Klug.

Pastors have been the Rev. H. Lommer, 1899-1908; the Rev. George Engel, 1908-10, and the Rev. Mr. Gross.

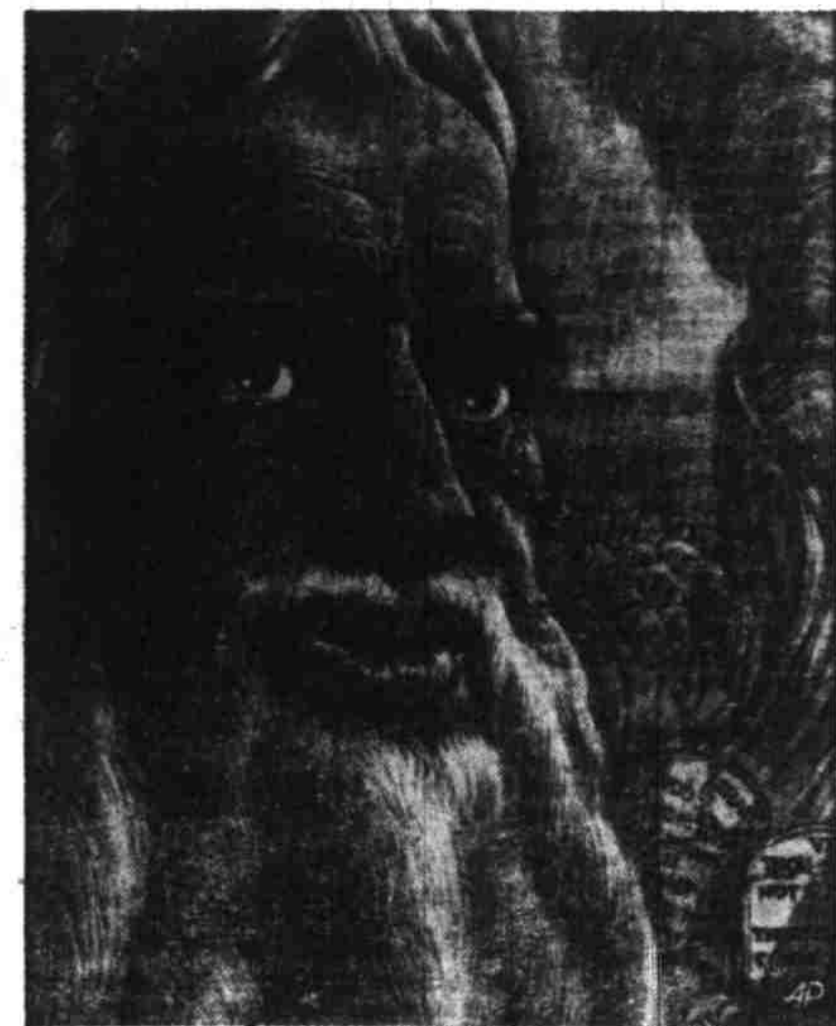

The Bible Story

MOSES



(Editor's note: This is the seventh of a series of studies from the Old Testament. The text is condensed from selections by Houston Harbo for the new book, "In Our Image." Illustration by Gly Rowe is also from the book, Copyright 1948 by Oxford University Press.)

In the third month, when the children of Israel were gone out of Egypt, came they into the wilderness of Sinai . . . and camped before the mount. And Moses went up unto God, and the Lord called unto him, saying, Thus shalt thou tell the children of Israel: If ye will keep my covenant, then ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation.

And Moses called for the elders of the people, and laid before their faces all these words which the Lord had commanded him. And Moses told the words of the people unto the Lord.

And the Lord said unto Moses, Go unto thy people, and sanctify them today and tomorrow, and let them wash their clothes, and be ready against the third day; for the third day the Lord will come down in the sight of all the people upon Mount Sinai . . .

And on the third day in the morning there were thunders and lightnings, and a thick cloud upon the mount, and the voice of the trumpet exceeding loud; so that all the people in the camp trembled. And Mount Sinai was altogether on a smoke, because the Lord descended upon it in fire. And God spake:

I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.

Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain. Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy: Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work.

Honour thy father and thy mother.

Thou shalt not kill.

Thou shalt not commit adultery.

Thou shalt not steal.

Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maid-servant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbor's.

And all the people saw the thunders, and the lightnings, and the noise of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking: and they stood afar off. And they said unto Moses, Speak thou with us, but let not God speak with us, lest we die.

And Moses said, Fear not; for God is come to prove you, and that his fear may be before your faces, that ye sin not.

And the Lord gave unto Moses, when he had made an end of communing with him upon Mount Sinai, two tables of testimony, tables of stone, written with the finger of God.
