Lutherans Note The Bible Story 50th Year for St. John's Here

Golden anniversary of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran church, af-filiated with the Missouri synod, will be observed Sunday at the 11 a.m. service. The congregation in 50 years has had only three pastors, and the Rev. H. W. Gross has served since 1910, making him the dean of Salem ministers. The service Sunday will be in

remembrance of the church's "blessings and opportunities."
Organized in November, 1899, with six voting members, the congregation erected its first building on Center street between 13th and 14th. Ten years later the structure was moved to 16th and A streets, where it still serves. A parsonage was built in 1912 and in 1915 a Christian day school which was discontinued in 1930.

The congregation now numbers some 580 baptized members, and two services are required each Sunday morning to accommodate them. A new \$150,000 church is being erected at 14th and Court
