

Bowl Choices Hinge on Tilts This Weekend

Three League Title Battles Thursday

NEW YORK, Nov. 20-(AP)—With California and Ohio State waiting official nods for Rose Bowl designation, college football turns this week to several ancient rivalries and conference scraps from which additional New Year's bowl teams will emerge.

Topping the rivalry list is Saturday's affair at Philadelphia, where Army presents its undefeated record to Navy and asks the Middies what they're going to do about it. Both Army, the nation's No. 4 team, and Navy were idle last week.

And Philadelphia gets another humdinger Thursday, Thanksgiving day, when Cornell and Pennsylvania clash in their annual game—this time for the Ivy League championship.

All Tulane must do to clinch the Southeastern conference crown and probably get a Sugar Bowl bid is beat Louisiana State at New Orleans Saturday. Under a special ruling, Kentucky's game with Miami (Fla.) University, at Miami Friday night, will count in the standings for Kentucky. A Kentucky victory coupled with a Tulane loss would leave the teams tied in the conference standings. Kentucky had been unable to schedule the required six games with conference members.

Other conference championships remain to be settled this week. The Rice Owls and Baylor Bears meet Saturday at Houston for the Southwest conference crown, and a spot in the Cotton Bowl. Down in New Orleans, Tulane faces Louisiana State, with an eye on the Sugar Bowl.

Two conference squabbles will be settled Thursday, when Wyoming plays Denver at Denver, and Detroit meets Wichita at Wichita, Kas. Wyoming is undefeated in the Skyline Six conference, but a Denver victory would drop the Cowboys into a tie for the title with Colorado A. & M.

Detroit, on top of the Missouri valley heap, must defeat Wichita to take clear title.

Texas Tech also can wrap up Border conference honors by defeating Hardin-Simmons Saturday at Lubbock, Tex.

North Carolina, thrice-beaten, plays Virginia at Durham, N. C., Saturday, with both still hopeful of a bowl bid somewhere.

Maryland also has bowl hopes. Beaten only by Michigan State, Maryland must get past West Virginia Thursday at College Park, Md., and Miami, Fla., there, Dec. 2.

With a Sugar Bowl bid virtually assured, Oklahoma tackles Oklahoma A. & M. Saturday at Norman. Last January, Oklahoma beat North Carolina in the Sugar Bowl, 14-6. The Big Seven title already has been clinched by Oklahoma.

Notre Dame entertains Southern California at South Bend, Ind., Saturday.

Ken Carpenter Eyes Pro Play

EUGENE, Nov. 20 (AP)—Ken Carpenter, halfback star of the Oregon State college gridiron squad, said here last night he planned to play professional football. He declined, however, to confirm that he has had offers from any club.

The big senior has been the running ace in the Staters' assault this year and also passed to teammates for touchdowns. His performance here yesterday, when Oregon State defeated Oregon, 20 to 10, was his final on collegiate turf.

Dons Humble Hilltoppers

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 20 (AP)—Scoring in every period, the University of San Francisco Dons defeated the Marquette Hilltoppers 39-20 in their intersectional football game here today before an estimated 12,000 fans.

It was the final contest of the season for each team. The Dons dominated the play almost from the start, scoring a touchdown in the first period, two more each in the second and third periods, and one more in the final quarter.

Marquette, blanked for the first half, scored in the third period and pushed over two more in the fourth.

The Hilltoppers contributed the most thrilling play of the encounter when their Halfback Lorry Plate, of Milwaukee, returned a punt 82 yards for his team's first touchdown.

San Francisco scored on an 85-yard march in the first period, and put together drives of 67 and 55 yards for second period tallies. The Dons traveled 63 yards and 26 yards for third quarter touchdowns.

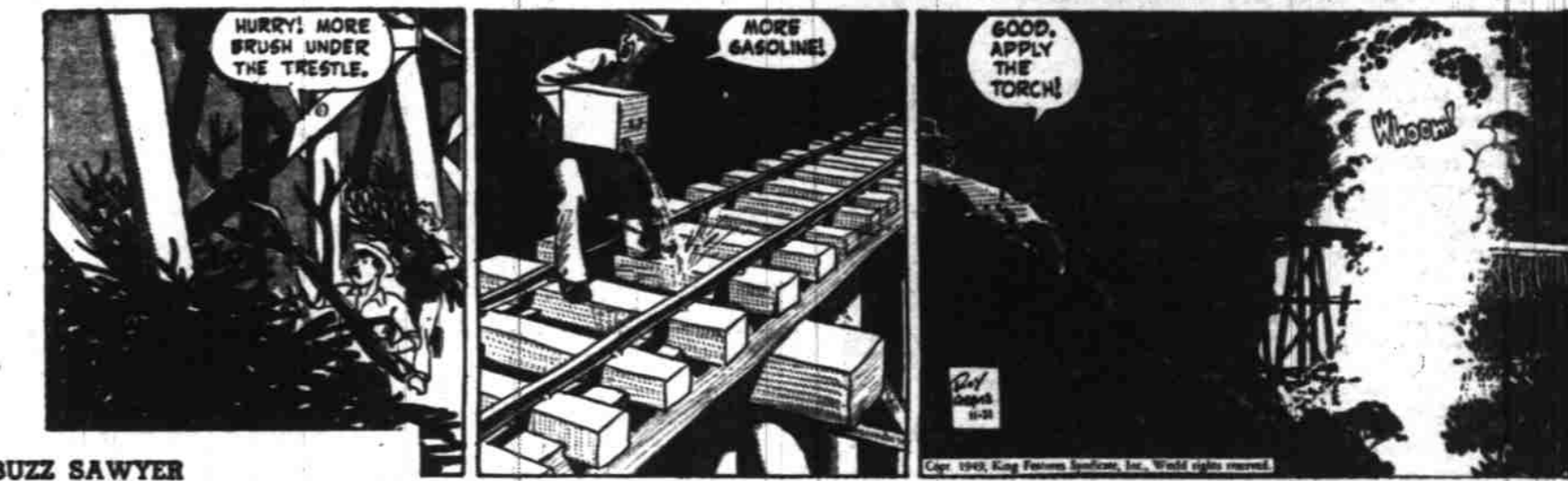
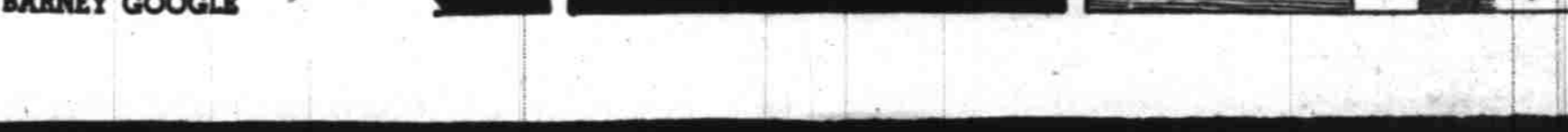
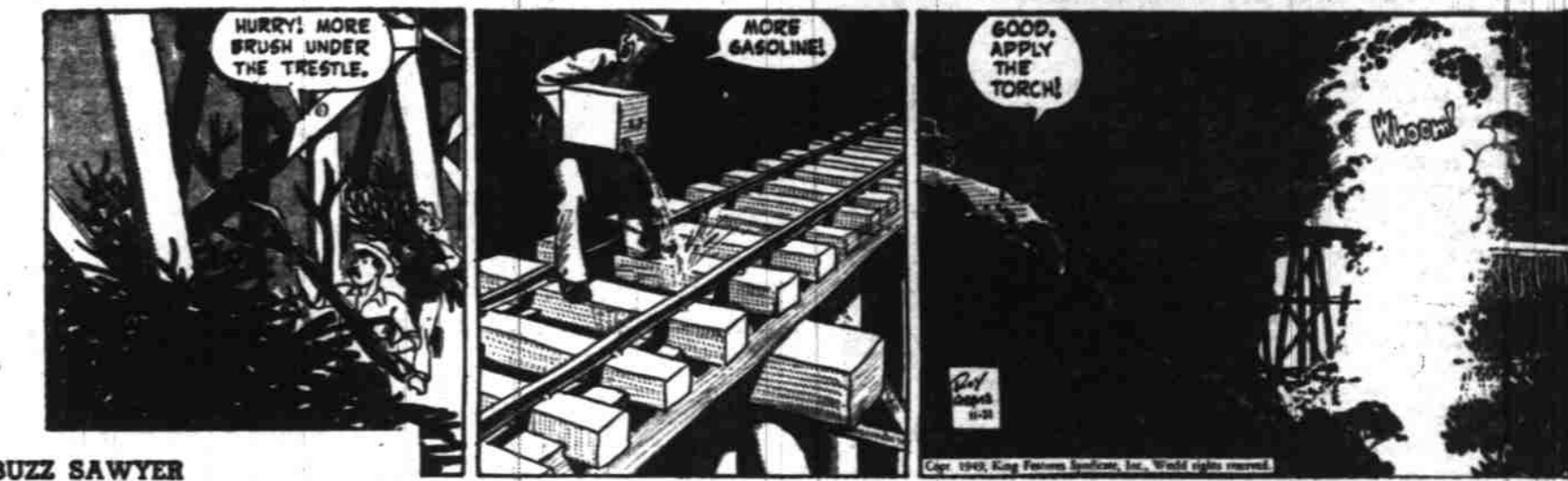
