Misses Wealth In Neon Lights

CLEVELAND -(INS)- Dr. Dayton C. Miller, former head of the physics department at Case Institute of Technology in Cleveland, never received a large salary and his budget was small.

So when he bought several small glass tubes at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair he used his own pocket money, and perhaps skimped a little on meals that week.

Dr. Miller had a Cleveland glass blower bend the tubes to shape the letters CASE, and then attached an 8,000-volt wire to the end and filled the tube with gas. The tube glowed with a blue-green light. Dr. Miller, in 1893, had for all intents and purposes a neon sign. Never A Profit

But the quiet, well-mannered professor never made a cent on his invention. It wasn't until five years later that neon, the gas now used in the gaudy advertising signs that light America's great white way, was discovered.
