



Tourists Flock to Site of Old Tomb

MEXICO CITY-(INS)-Ixcateopan, where archaeologists have just discovered the tomb of the last Aztec emperor, Cuauhtemoc, has become the new tourist attraction of Mexico.

Although there are no hotels, restaurants or other facilities for the tourist, hundreds of Americans and other visitors are already swarming through the tiny Indian town.

Members of the expedition who discovered the tomb under the main altar of the parish church have confirmed the discovery as unquestionably the tomb of Cuauhtemoc.

Mexico City newspapers are filled with news of the find and Ixcateopan is filled with reporters who watch each move the expedition makes.

It is understood that the federal government plans to open a museum to hold the remains of the emperor and the objects discovered in his tomb.
