### Rumors Also Have Yale Getting Root

SEATTLE, Jan. 10 (AP)—The rumor factory was making transcontinental shipments of two football coaches today, but neither had started packing for the trip. Rumor No. 1 had Reg Root moving from the University of Washington to Yale — from assistant football coach here to athletic director at New Haven.

No. 2 report from the grapevine would send George Sauer, who quit recently as Navy's grid boss, to Washington State college.

Sauer said in Baltimore he had "heard reports" he might be picked to succeed Phil Sarboe at WSC, but added he had not been contacted by the college. The school's athletic director, Robert Brumblay, is in New York City attending the NCAA meeting and said he hoped to meet with Sauer.

The Root report came in an item from New Haven saying the lanky ex-lawyer was top man on the list of prospectives for the athletic directorship dropped by Bob Kipphut.

### Gale Plans Quint

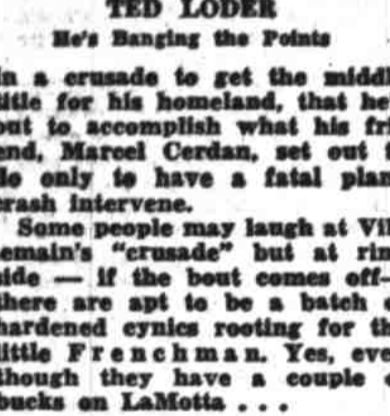
