## Thomas Backs Brannan Plan In Lions Talk

A farm program like the Brannan plan would preserve family type farming and stabilize this nation's agricultural economy, Salem Lions club was told Thursday by Lyle Thomas, state secretary of the Oregon Farmers union and a state representative from Polk county.

Absence of a government farm program would lead to industrial-type farming controlled by a few individuals, Thomas averred at the club luncheon in the Marion hotel. And even the present farm supports by the government are not much better, the speaker indicated.

Under a Brannan plan, said Thomas, all farm products would be considered basic commodities, not just the vote-getting few like tobacco, peanuts, wheat, corn, rice and cotton. Subsidies would be in the form of direct payments to farmers, not the purchase and removal from market of surpluses from bumper crops, he added.

Thomas called his listeners' attention to tariffs and other government measures which aid industry. "Farm economy is declining while industrial economy continues on the upswing," he said. "We must recognize the difference between these economies and the need for an effective farm program."

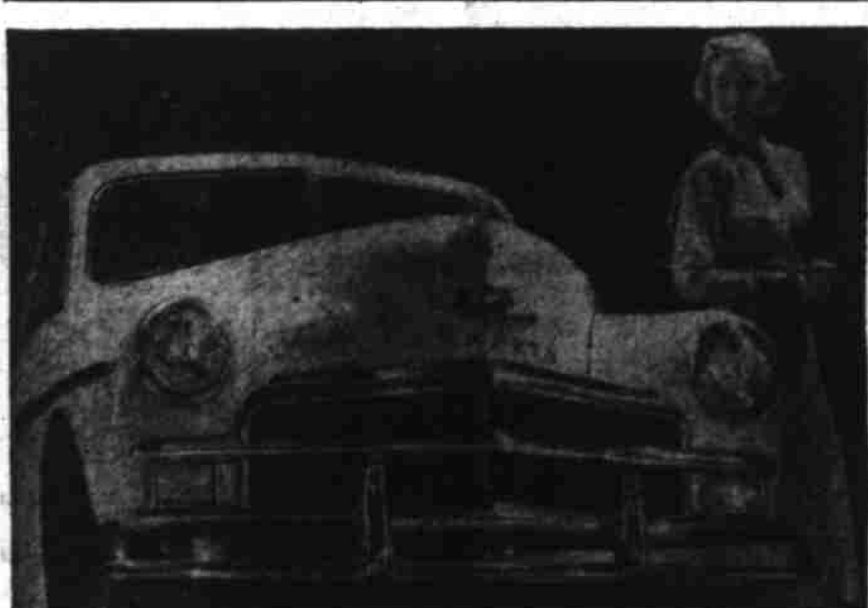
