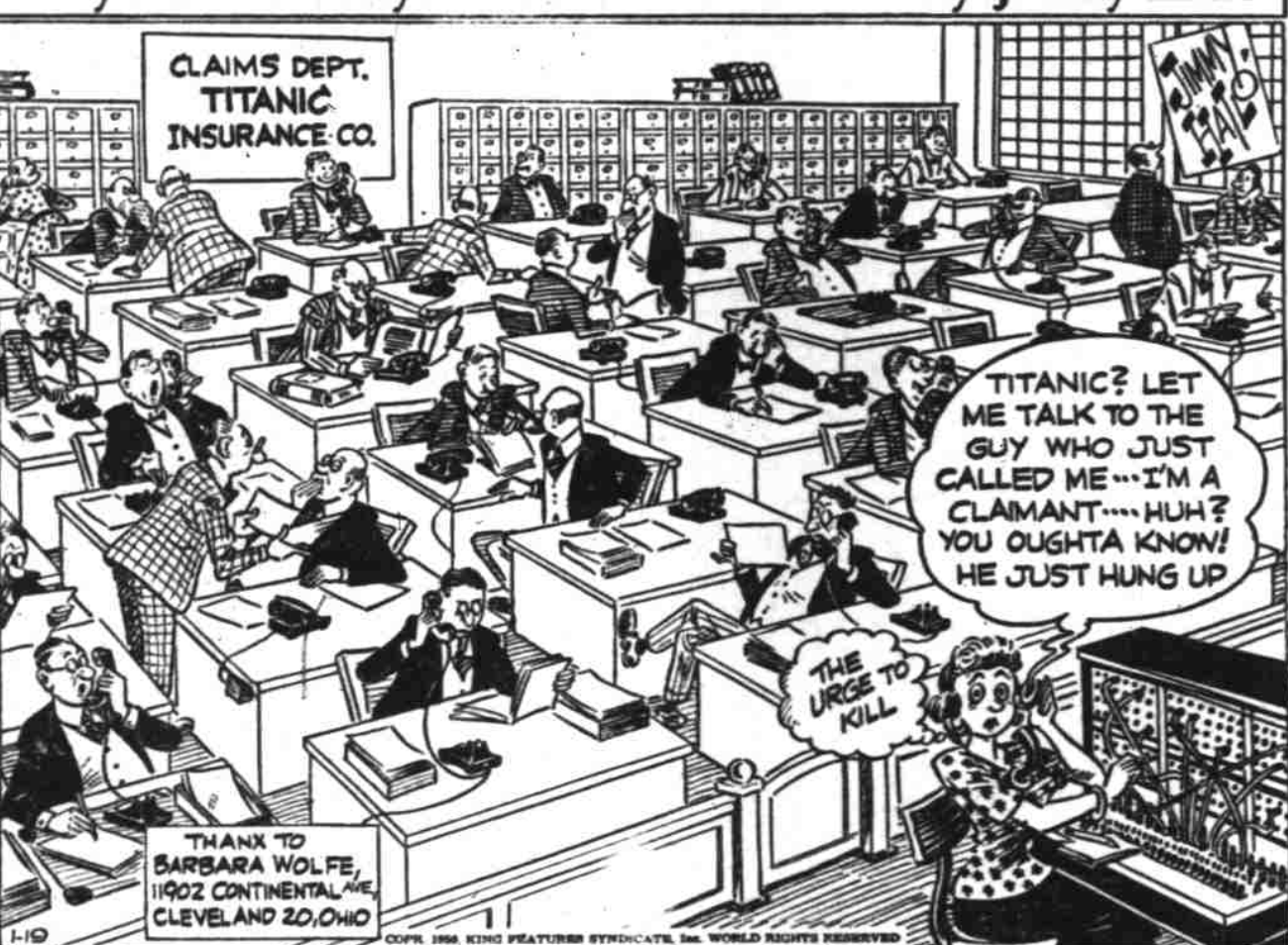

\$20,000 Lopped Off Salary Time Comes! Slipping Feller Takes Big Cut

CLEVELAND, Jan. 18 (AP)—Bob Feller, the richest but no longer the best pitcher in baseball, took a whopping pay cut of possibly \$20,000 today at his own suggestion.

The fading, 31-year-old fastballer, who got into organized baseball in 1936, when still a raw farm ball from Iowa, signed to play his 12th season for the Cleveland Indians.

A few seasons ago, Feller was knocking down around \$80,000 for an all-time baseball high.

But this year, observers think he'll play for about \$45,000.

The reason, explained General Manager Hank Greenberg, is that for the first time since 1939 Feller will pitch for a straight salary—without attendance bonuses.

Feller grinned happily, anyway, as he signed. So did Greenberg and Ellis Ryan, the new president of the Indians. Hank cracked:

"Now I'm getting even with Feller for striking me out so many times when I played for Detroit."

Then Greenberg got more serious and explained:

"You can call this a very drastic pay cut. Feller thinks it's drastic, too. But he himself made the suggestion. In fact, he offered to take more than the 25 per cent maximum pay cut allowed."

"There was absolutely nothing to it. We all agreed quickly on the figure after Bob showed up yesterday."

Even at that, Feller remains the second highest paid Indian, topped only by Shortstop Manager Lou Boudreau. Lou will pull in around \$65,000 on the second year of his two-year contract.

Last year, Feller won 15 and lost 14 after a slow start and earned around \$65,000 (40,000 guarantee plus \$25,000 bonus); in 1948, he won 19 and lost 15 and got about \$80,000; in 1947, he had a 20-11 record and possibly topped that.

It is more possible that the break came on the very first tee, and Snead doubtless knew he had "the Little Man" this day.

Hogan's first tee shot was to the left—out of bounds. Hogan doesn't drive out of bounds from the first tee. Not steelnerved Hogan. But he did.

He recovered in amazing style to get his par five on the hole, but Snead clipped in a birdie and was off. Hogan, appearing more grim and taut than at any time during the play in the tournament, three-putted the second for five strokes. Hogan has been getting birdies on the early holes, at least before fatigue set in.

There was Hogan on the difficult, slanting green of the fifteenth. He twice sank 50-foot putts there last week. Today he missed a five-footer.

Snead outdrove him on almost every hole, while Ben was wild off the tee. Snead had 32 putts, Hogan 35. Hogan rimmed the cup from 30, 40 feet out on at least three greens. Snead sank putts from 10 and 11 feet, but generally they were much shorter.

This was hardly the Hogan who put together rounds of 73-69-69-69 for his 280 last week. This was the Snead who brought on the deadlock with rounds of 71-72-71-66 for 280.

Snead goes on into the Long Beach open this weekend. Hogan goes to Palm Springs for a rest.
