

Oregon Churches' Convention Due Monday at Forest Grove

Several Salem area church leaders are to be in Forest Grove next week for the annual convention of the Oregon Council of Churches, Monday through Wednesday.

Gov. Douglas McKay will be one of the speakers at the Tuesday evening banquet, where Dr. Chester W. Hamblin, pastor of First Presbyterian church, will be toastmaster. Dr. Roy Lockenour and Mrs. C. W. Stacey will present a report of the council's legislative action committee. Others expected to attend include the Rev. Brooks Moore, pastor of First Methodist church, the Rev. Dudley Strain, pastor of First Christian church.

The convention will open Monday with registration at First Methodist church, where most sessions will be held. Keynote speaker at that evening's meeting will be Dr. Clifford Barbour, Nashville, Tenn., national moderator of the Presbyterian church, U.S.A. A new religious film, "Kyoto Story," will be shown.

Tuesday's sessions, beginning at 9 a. m., will include a talk by Methodist Bishop Gerald Kennedy of Portland and reports of council committees on Christian education, migrant missions, social action, youth action, Church World Service, rural ministry and Council of Church Women. Seminars that day, each led by a minister and a layman, will be on the topics of civic affairs, family, stewardship, evangelism, church schools and "Our Present Day World Task."

Business Tuesday afternoon will feature election of officers and discussions of the proposed merger of Oregon and Portland Councils of Churches.

At the banquet Tuesday, principal speaker will be the Rev. Gertrude Apel, executive secretary of Washington-Northern Idaho Council of Churches. That evening denominational executives will present a panel on "What We Want to See the Churches Do Together in Oregon."

Wednesday will be featured by adoption of specific recommendations for future church cooperation. Other speakers of the convention will include Dr. Sanford Fleming of Berkeley, Calif.; Dr. James Millar of Portland; Dr. Paul Payne of New York.

Buckner Resigns Stayton Church

The Bible Story DAVID and SAUL

As David returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, Abner brought him before Saul. Saul set him over the men of war, and he was accepted in the sight of all people. And when the women came out, singing and dancing, and said, Saul hath slain his thousands, and David his ten thousands, Saul was very wrath, and said, What can he have more but the kingdom? And Saul eyed David from that day forward.

Saul spake to all his servants, that they should kill David. But Jonathan, Saul's son, delighted much in David; and told David, My father seeketh to kill thee: hide thyself; and I will commune with my father of thee. And if it please my father to do thee evil, I will show it thee: I will shoot arrows, as though at a mark. And I will send a lad; saying, Go, find the arrows. If I say unto the lad, The arrows are on this side of thee; then come thou: for there is peace to thee, and no hurt. But if I say, The arrows are beyond thee; go thy way. So David hid himself in the field.

And the king sat down to eat, and David's place was empty. Saul said, Wherefore cometh not the son of Jesse to meat today? Jonathan answered, David asked leave of me to go to Bethlehem. Then Saul's anger was kindled, and he cast a javelin at him. Whereby Jonathan knew that it was determined of his father to slay David.

And in the morning Jonathan went out into the field. And he shot an arrow, and cried, Is not the arrow beyond thee? Make speed, David; therefore escaped. And every one in distress gathered unto him; and he became a captain over about 400 men.

And the Philistines invaded the land and Saul went against them. When Saul returned, he took 3,000 men and went to seek David. And he came to a cave and went into cover his feet. David arose and cut off the skirt of Saul's robe. Saul rose up and went on his way. David also went out of the cave and cried, My lord the king. When Saul looked behind him, David said, Behold this day the Lord delivered thee into mine hand; in that I cut off the skirt and killed thee, now know thou that I have not sinned against thee; yet thou huntest my soul to take it. Saul wept. And he said to David, Thou art more righteous than I, for thou hast rewarded me good, whereas I have rewarded thee evil. And now, I know that thou shalt surely be king. Swear now that thou wilt not cut off my seed after me. And David swore unto Saul.

Now the Philistines fought against Israel, and Saul was sore wounded. Then said Saul to his armorbearer, Thrust me through. But his armorbearer would not. Therefore Saul took a sword, and fell upon it. So Saul died, and his three sons, that day together.

David lamented with this lamentation over Saul and Jonathan: The beauty of Israel is slain upon thy high places: how are the mighty fallen! Tell it not in Gath, publish it not in the streets of Askelon; lest the daughters of the Philistines rejoice, lest the daughters of the uncircumcised triumph. I am distressed for thee, my brother Jonathan: very pleasant hast thou been unto me: thy love to me was wonderful, passing the love of women.
