Hearing Set on State Power Safety Code

A new state safety code concerning all phases of activity in the transmission of power, now being planned by the state industrial accident commission, will be the object of a public hearing in Portland on February 2 at 10 a.m. in the Portland hotel. Representatives of organized labor, employer and supplier groups are to attend and will be heard. The new code is expected to strengthen safety measures for workmen and others dealing with equipment used in the mechanical transmission of power. This meeting will be the final public consideration prior to adoption, the commission said. It will mark the commission's first public hearing this year.

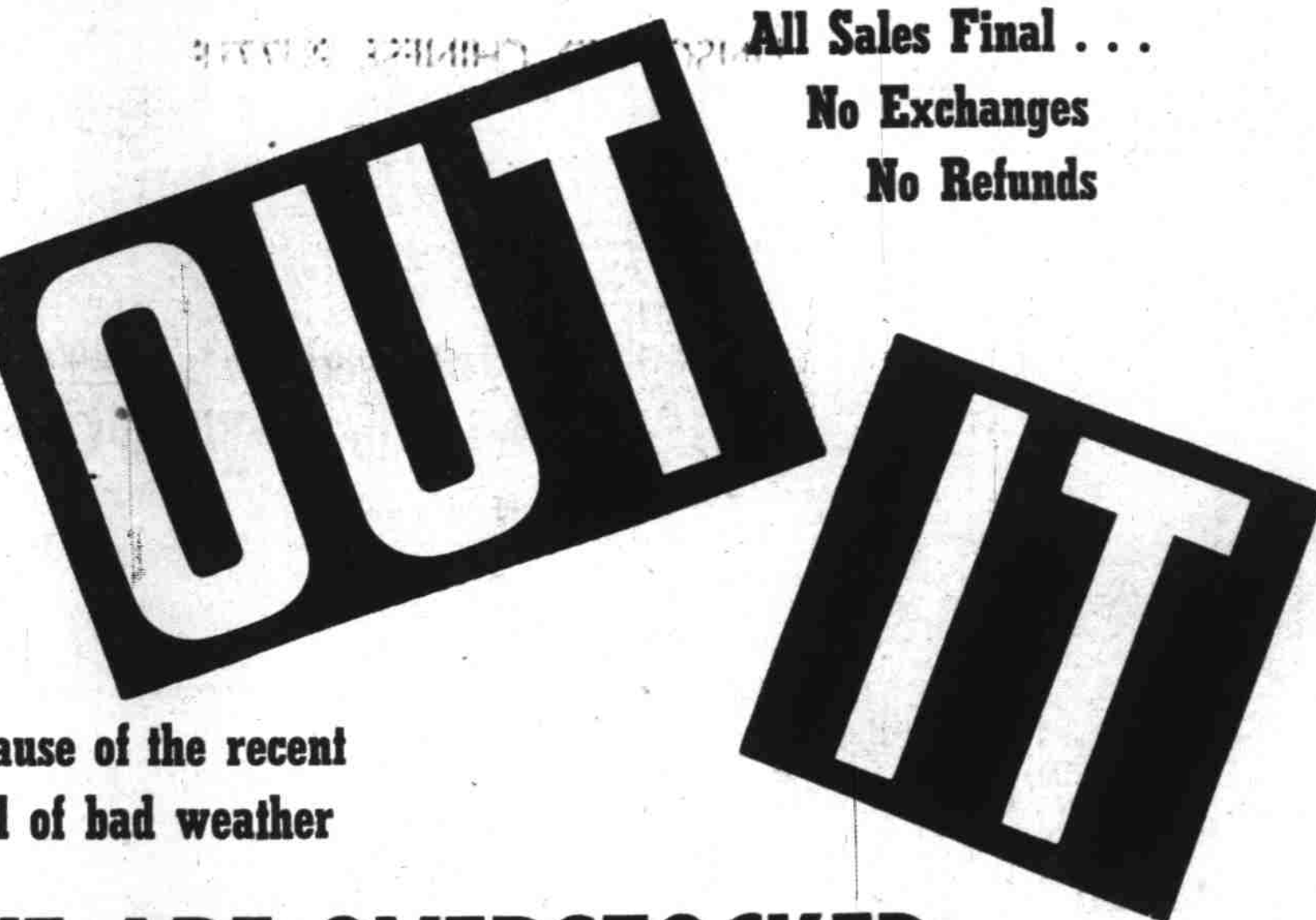
