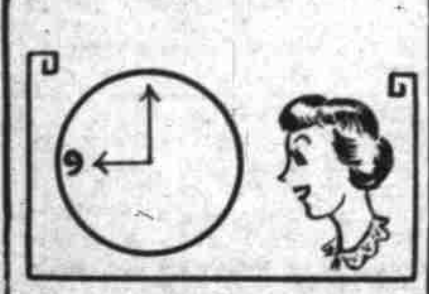
PHONE COMPANY ELECTS
