

Jury Awards \$4,251 for Smash Hurts

A Marion county jury Tuesday awarded \$4,251 to William H. Johnston of Salem as compensation for injuries incurred in an auto accident near Brooks March 29, 1949.

The verdict was returned against Jay C. Herron, 645 Judson st., after a two-day trial in circuit court here. Johnston alleged that Herron attempted to pass without a clear lane ahead and without his lights burning.

Berry and another passenger in his car, Beatrice James, 575 S. 25th st., also have filed suits against Herron. Berry asks \$9,006 and Mrs. James seeks \$10,720. The cases are expected to come to trial in the near future.

Victim of Stray Bullet Mending

SILVERTON, Jan. 24 — Eight-year-old Ruby Ann Briggs, victim Monday of a stray bullet fired by two hawk hunters, was reported "getting along well" today at Silverton hospital.

The girl, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Briggs, is expected to remain in the hospital about a week. She was wounded in the hip and leg while playing near her home two miles southeast of Silverton.

The hunters, George Peters of Silverton and Delbert Davis of Portland, have pleaded guilty in justice court here to charges of firing across a public highway. They are due for sentencing Friday.

Carson Suggested For Senate Post

PORTLAND, Jan. 24-(AP)—Joseph K. Carson, U. S. maritime commission member and former mayor of Portland, was proposed today as a democratic candidate for U. S. senator.

The suggestion came from W. L. Joellin, democratic state chairman, as he introduced Carson at a meeting of the Willamette democratic society. Carson made no comment.

Repair Okehed For Forestry Office Building

Repairs for the burned-out office building of the state forestry department in Salem were authorized Tuesday by the state board of control.

Cost of repairing the building, damaged by fire January 1, was estimated at \$15,700. In addition, \$1,505 was authorized to replace equipment damaged by the blaze. The state restoration fund covers the entire loss.

The board also approved claims totaling \$168 to cover tools and hose damaged in fire fighting activities of the forestry department last summer.

Discussion of a contract with Pacific Power and Light company for furnishing power to the new office building in Portland was delayed a week. The board decided to wait until Paul B. McKee, company president, returns from Washington, D. C.

Jamboree Bids Three Troops In Scout Area

Three full troops totaling 99 boys and nine adult leaders, will represent the Cascade area Boy Scout council at the national scout jamboree this summer instead of the original two units.

The Salem scout office reported Tuesday that 71 scouts and three leaders had been signed to date. The jamboree will be held in July at Valley Forge, Pa.

Applicants for the trip are evenly divided over the council said the office. Cherry city (Salem) district has registered 25 boys; Silver Falls and Polk district, 23 and Calapooia district, 26.

A. H. Danforth, World War I Veteran, Dies

Arthur Henry Danforth, Salem resident since 1937, died Monday at his home at 960 N. 16th st. after an extended illness. He was 61.

Born Jan. 12, 1889, in Manistee, Mich., Danforth served with the 149th division in France during World War I and participated in every major battle during 1917 and 1918.

He was married Oct. 7, 1930, in Seattle to the former Margaret Holthe, who survives him. The couple lived several years in Portland and later resided in Salem before coming to Salem.

Danforth was employed by the Kraft Foods company until his retirement several years ago. He was sales manager in both Portland and Seattle.

Surviving, besides the widow, are his son, Danny of Salem; three sisters, Mrs. Eva Senour and Mrs. Myrtle Schultz, both of Milwaukee, Wis., and Mrs. Emma Fisher, Chicago, Ill.; and two brothers, Frank Danforth, Milwaukee, Wis., and William Danforth, Cleveland, Ohio.

Funeral services will be held Thursday at 1:30 p. m. at the Howell-Edwards chapel with the Rev. Lloyd Uecker officiating. Interment will be in City View cemetery with military services by VFW post 861 of which Danforth was a member.

Troops, Police Hunt Dutch Guerrilla Head

JAKARTA (Batavia) U. S. I., Jan. 24-(AP)—Federal troops and police joined tonight in a hunt for a Dutch guerrilla leader whose band killed scores of persons in a raid on Bandoeng Monday.

The leader is R. P. P. "Turk" Westerling, 30, militant exponent of a strong West Java state who formerly was a captain of commandos in the Dutch army.

"He is more than a rebel," declared Mohamed Hatta, premier of the month-old United States of In-

donesia. "He is an enemy." The lightning blow at Bandoeng, a city of 180,000 about 120 miles southeast of Jakarta, was the first outright revolt against the government which took over the rule of the East Indies when the islands gained independence from The Netherlands Dec. 29.

A neutral military source estimated Westerling's 800 troops, including some identified as Dutch army deserters, slew 360 Indonesian soldiers and civilians in Bandoeng and adjacent towns. Sixty of these were reported to have been Indonesian soldiers. The Dutch garrison at Bandoeng did not take part in the fight.

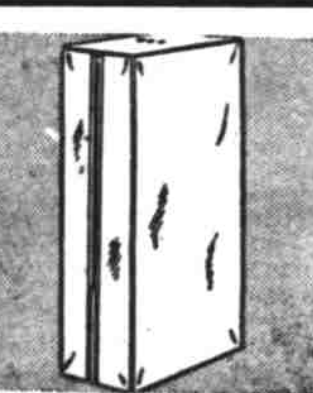

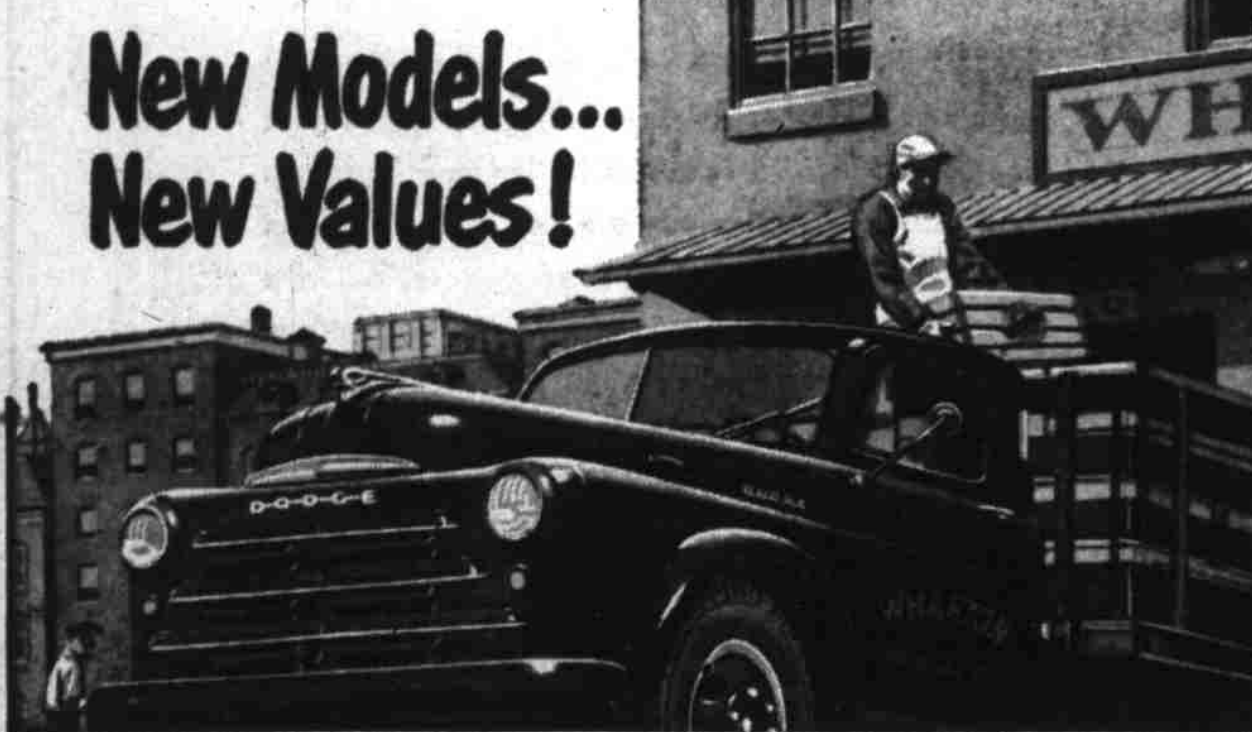
