CHICAGO, Jan. 25-(AP)-Firmness in corn and easiness in wheat featured dealings on the board of trade today. Other grains held about steady.

The contrasting trends in wheat and corn showed up right at the start and carried through to the close. There was one period in mid-morning when the whole market weakened, carrying corn along with it, but prices rebounded from that sell-off.

Wheat ended 14-11/8 lower, corn was 1/4-1/8 higher, oats were 1/4 lower to % higher, rye was unchanged to 1/2 lower, soybeans were 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher and lard was 10 to 20 cents a hundred pounds lower.

Snow in wide areas of Nebraska and Kansas, which should be of help to the new crop, weakened July and September bread cereal deliveries. But even the March contract eased, despite trade reports that the United Kingdom had taken a cargo of wheat and Mexico had bought 1,250,000 bushels. Although the western part of

Kansas has been dry since Oct. 10, the weather bureau said, "generally in a dry fall the most important factor toward a wheat crop in this area is getting the wheat up. That has been accomplished and wheat roots extend into moist subsoil."
