OCE Teacher Registration Up at OCE

MONMOUTH - A jump of nearly 28 per cent in students registered in teacher training training courses was revealed today in final registration figures for winter term at Oregon College of Education. A total of 454 are studying education courses this year, compared to 355 last year.

In all, 564 students signed up for the term, an increase of 16 per cent over last year's figures for the same term. 110 are taking lower division work.

The increase in total enrollment followed a pattern set in fall term, when OCE's classes were swelled by a 20 per cent jump.

OCE continues to attract veterans, as indicated by an increase last year. There are 192 veterans lology major. studying here now: 163 men, 8 women attended under PL 346, while 9 men and 1 woman are carried under PL 16. Five are registered under state aid, and six are going it on their own.
