

Salem Trio Hear Charges Cited in Court

Two Salem men charged with burglary and forgery started to retrace the path of their purported crimes via the courts Thursday.

David R. Cook and Harold B. Lancelle, both of 635 S. Liberty st., were arraigned in Woodburn justice court Thursday afternoon.

In the morning they, together with Cook's wife, had appeared in the county district court.

Detectives said a hold has been placed on the men by Washington county for alleged break-ins there, and indicated warrants would come from Polk county, also.

Lancelle waived preliminary hearing and was bound over to the grand jury in both courts. He faces burglary on three counts, forgery on one.

The case against Cook and his wife was continued to Saturday for entering a plea in district court. He is charged with burglary on two counts and forgery. She faces one count of each.

In Woodburn justice court Cook received a similar continuance on a burglary charge. He and Lancelle are held in lieu of \$7,500 bail each.

Mrs. Cook also is held at the county jail in lieu of \$3,000 bail.

Morse, Doctors Hold Conference On Medical Plans

Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore) does not favor socialized medicine as such, and he does not think the president's compulsory health insurance plan will pass, but he does believe some states are vitally in need of more comprehensive medical programs, he declared in Salem Wednesday.

The senator met with a group of 15 Salem doctors. Acting chairman was Dr. Howard Kuriz.

The doctors presented their belief that voluntary pre-paid medicine would answer the need.

Morse was quoted as saying no satisfactory so-called socialized medicine program yet had been devised, but that he thought some program should be worked out whereby individual states would have federal aid available to them for medical care if such were sought.

13 MINERS KILLED

ST. ELOY, France, Jan. 26 —(AP)—Thirteen coal miners were killed today in a violent underground explosion. Twenty others suffering from gas poisoning were hospitalized.

Women Tell of Buying Babies

PORTLAND, Jan. 26 —(AP)—Two Portland women testified today they were able to get babies from a Seattle maternity home for cash.

Their testimony resulted in a \$200 fine for middle-aged Mrs. Bea Roach, Portland, who admitted handling the deals.

There were two formal charges against her — each of child-placing, an illegal activity in Oregon for anyone other than a qualified social worker.

District Judge John B. Mears gave her the maximum fine of \$100 on each charge, which he called an inadequate penalty.

Troops, Rebels 'Shoot It Out' In Indonesia

JAKARTA, Java, U. S. I., Jan. 26 —(AP)—Indonesian federal troops, seeking to crush a West Java rebel movement, shot it out with an armed band of deserters from Dutch service in downtown Jakarta today and hauled off two truckloads as prisoners.

Seven persons were killed and a number wounded, it was announced.

A witness said five of the dead were federal soldiers; two were members of the rebel band.

The clash came as soldiers of this month-old nation combed the capital for Indonesian deserters from the immobilized Royal Netherlands Indies army (Knil) suspected of throwing in with the guerrilla force of a tough former Dutch captain, R. P. P. "Turk" Westerling.

Mobile police officers reported the action was set off by an attack of the rebel band on a police post in the shopping district.

Police said the men wore the green caps and the red caps that distinguish Indonesian parachute troops and commandos in the service of the Netherlands, which gave Indonesia independence under the Dutch crown Dec. 28.

Keizer Dike District To Elect Directors

Election of the nine directors for the newly formed Keizer dike district will be March 3, Marion county court ordered Thursday as it signed the formal order creating the district.

Balloting will be from 1 to 8 p.m. at Keizer Grange hall.

Price of Brides Causes Unrest

LONDON, Jan. 26 —(AP)—A newspaper in Nigeria, the Lagos Daily Times, has called upon Britain to control the price of brides. High costs of brides, it said, was causing unrest in the colony.

The British government weighed the situation and reported to-day it wouldn't do anything about it. Inflated prices for brides are out of the province of price-fixing, it said, and since the practice of buying brides is recognized by native law, Britain has not interfered.

Dog Poisoner Active in Salem

Reports indicate a dog poisoner is at work here, according to Joe Irish, city poundmaster.

Irish said Thursday he had just investigated a poisoning in West Salem. Other cases have been reported to county authorities from the Keizer district this month.

Irish suggested that parents caution young children about picking up food in the streets. He said it might be poisoned and intended to kill dogs.

Insurance Firm Tax Sent to Senate

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26 —(AP)—The house today passed and sent to the senate a bill laying a \$90,000,000 tax on life insurance companies.

The insurance bill levying on part of the \$4,500,000,000 untaxed 1947, 1948 and 1949 investments of the insurance companies represented the first victory for a part of President Truman's new tax program.

HOLLYWOOD, Jan. 26 —(AP)—A seven-pound, 14-ounce son was born by caesarian section today to actress Betty Garrett, wife of the singing actor, Larry Parks. The parents chose Garrett Christopher Parks as the baby's name. Married five years, it is their first child.

PORTLAND, Jan. 26 —(AP)—Sen. Wayne L. Morse left for Washington, D. C., tonight after a week's speech-packed visit to his home state. Morse plans to return to Oregon February 8 to attend a flood control hearing at Pendleton.

SEATTLE, Jan. 26 —(AP)—The western group power pool reached its all time momentary peak of 3,621,000 kilowatts at 5:45 p. m., last night, the Seattle office of the Bonneville power administration noted today.

Previous peak, recorded Jan. 17, was 3,618,000 KW.

The office said the power load today appeared to be a little under yesterday, but still very heavy, with all steam plants required during peak hours.

This week's heavy load was attributed in part to restoration of most distributor facilities which had been down because of icing conditions.

Russians Claim Man, 141, Has Family of 120

LONDON, Jan. 26 —(AP)—A man 141 years old lives in the mountain village of Soviet Azerbaijan, where he heads a family of 120, the Moscow radio said tonight.

He was identified as Mahmud Alavdov. The broadcast said a "good part of his village consists of his children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.
