

Bauer Hurdles Another Rival

But Hopkins Upset In Women's Tourney

MIAMI, Fla., Jan. 27-(AP)-Pretty Marlene Bauer edged into the semi-finals of the 18th annual Helen Lee Doherty amateur women's golf tournament today as she came from behind to shade Marjorie Lindsay one up.

The surprise upset of the day was Edean Anderson's 3 and 2 victory over Jean Hopkins of Cleveland, O. Miss Anderson, a 19-year-old brunette from Helena, Mont., is playing in the Doherty tournament for the first time.

Miss Hopkins, who became a favorite when she upset defending champion Dorothy Kirby in the first round, said she was beaten today by "very good golf."

The Montana shotmaker held a lopsided 4 up lead at the end of nine holes after carding a one under women's par 37 on the front side. She went 5 up on the par three 11th hole but Miss Hopkins won the 13th and 14th with par fours to trim Miss Anderson's margin to 3 up. They halved the 15th and 16th, ending the match.

Polly Riley, winner of the Tampa Women's Open golf tournament last week, moved into the semi-finals with her 3 and 2 victory over Mrs. Catherine Fox Park of Bloomfield, N. J.

Peggy Kirk of Findlay, Ohio, turned in her best round of the tournament as she eliminated Miami's only representative left in the championship flight, Miss James D. Platt, Jr., 3 and 2.

Marlene and Miss Kirk are matched in the semi-finals tomorrow and Miss Anderson and Miss Riley compete for the finals berth.

'Deal' Rumors

CHICAGO, Jan. 27-(AP)-Bill Veck, former president of the Cleveland Indians, today denied a report he is negotiating for controlling interest in either the Chicago Cubs or Washington Senators.

Veck, whose family home is at nearby Hinsdale, Ill., said "I was as surprised as anybody" when he read the report written by Russ Newland, west coast Associated Press sports editor, at San Francisco.

"Let's put it this way," said Veck. "I've made no bids, no offers, no communications of any kind to buy a ball club, period." (Veck consistently denied rumors which preceded his eventual purchase and sale of the Cleveland Indians).

F. K. Wrigley, owner of the Cubs, was out of town and not available for comment on Newland's "baseball grapevine" report from a "reliable" source.

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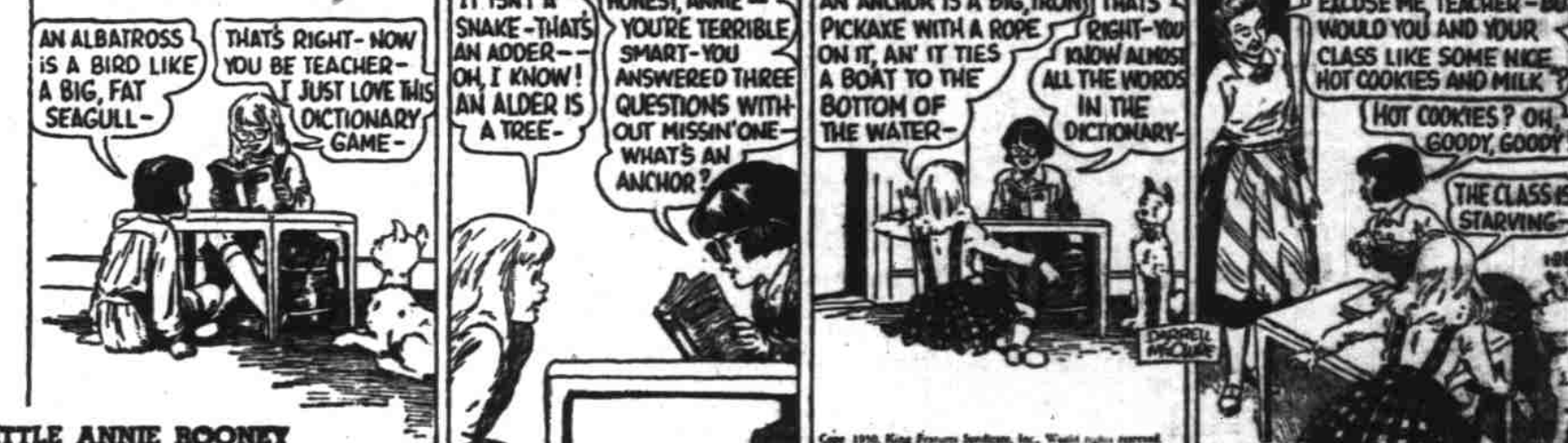
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
