La Motta-Wagner Go Slated at Detroit

NEW YORK, Jan. 29 (AP)—Midweight Champ Jake La Motta of New York goes to the post at Detroit Friday against Dick Wagner of Toppensish, Wash., in a non-title ten rounder that tops the week's boxing program.

Boxing critics will watch closely La Motta's performance following his poor effort against Robert Villena of France in his last outing at Madison Square Garden. La Motta expects to engage in several over-the-weight tuneups before risking his 160-pound crown outdoors in June.

Welterweight Chamorro Ray Robinson, who may get the title shot at La Motta next summer, also makes a non-title appearance against George Larover of Philadelphia tomorrow night at New Haven, Conn. It will be the start of a busy program for Sugar Ray, from New York's Harlem district.

Villena makes his first appearance since he whipped La Motta in an over-the-weight match, Dec. 9 when he mixes with Jean Stock, French middleweight champ, at Paris tomorrow.

Steve Bellosse of New York, another top ranking middleweight contender, gets back into action against Anton Radnik of Estonia at Buffalo Tuesday.

Joe Louis, the retired heavyweight king, continues his exhibition tour, facing Gene Jones of Camden, N. J., in six rounds at Miami Wednesday. Jones is an old Jersey Joe Walcott and Ezzard Charles sparring.

The Doucen brothers go tomorrow—Maxie at home in New Orleans against Argentine Guillermo Gimenez and Brother Bernie at Philadelphia against Otis Graham.

Lebanon Track Remodeling Set

LEBANON—Lebanon Meadows, finest horse racing plant in the state outside of Portland, will undergo extensive remodeling as soon as weather will permit start of the work. It was decided at the annual stockholders meeting last week.

Plans include construction of two new horse barns, roofing of the west side grandstand, and installation of lights for night racing this year. Two five-night meets are planned this season, one during the week of the Strawberry Fair in early June and the other during the week previous to the state fair, it was announced by Rep. Warren Gill.

Gill reported to the stockholders that the state racing commission had notified him that Lebanon racing plant was holder of fourth place for largest gate, number of races run, and amount of money bet during the past year. The local plant was topped only by Portland Meadows, Multnomah county fair races, and the state fair races.

Of the \$25,000 bet during the two day initial racing meet last summer, bettors were paid back \$22,500 in winnings, \$750 went to the state, and the balance returned to the Lebanon racing commission.

Gill also stated that 14 of the 24 winners at Lebanon last year were Oregon bred horses. "This is especially gratifying to me," said Gill, "since last year in the state legislature, we authorized pari-mutuel betting on quarter-horses to promote horse breeding in the state. This indicates the action is bearing excellent results."

Half of all Lebanon races last year were quarter horse events. The only other Oregon bred winners were at Portland Meadows, where quarter horse events were tried.

CORTINA D'AMPEZZO, Italy, Jan. 29 (AP)—The daring Swiss team of Fritz Feirabend and Stefan Waser rocketed to victory today in the world two-man bobsled championship races, beating out the American team of Stan Benham and Pat Martin.

Feirabend and Waser flashed down the 1,760 meter course, with its 16 treacherous curves in a total time of 5 minutes, 57.73 seconds in four runs yesterday and today.

Benham, from Lake Placid, N. Y., and his brakeman, Martin, of Massena, N. Y., were clocked in 6 minutes, 6.11 seconds for the four runs.
