

# Harper Captures Tucson Open Play

## Leader Fades On Final Day

### Snead Takes Second Cash on Fast Finish

TUCSON, Ariz., Feb. 5 (AP)—A driving finish to day earned Chandler Harper, Portsmouth, Va., first prize money of \$2,000 in the \$10,000 Tucson Open golf tournament.

Harper took birdies on the last three holes to card a score of 68 for the day and a total of 267 for the 72 holes of play. This was 13 under par for the El Rio 6,402-yard layout.

At the start of the final nine holes Harper was two strokes back of Manuel de la Torre, the little known assistant pro from Glencoe, Ill.

Sam Snead, White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., was three strokes back of de la Torre at the start of the final nine. The big-money winner from West Virginia finished with 269. This gave him second prize money of \$1,400.

De la Torre and U. S. Open Champion Cary Middlecoff of Ormond Beach, Fla., finished with scores of 270 and earned \$900 each for a third place tie.

Jack Burke, Jr., White Plains, N. Y., took a one-under-par 69 today and wound up with a total of 271.

The veteran Jim Ferrier, San Francisco, Calif., and Glenn Teal, Memphis, Tenn., finished one stroke back of Burke with totals of 272.

Jimmy Demaret, Ojai, Calif., who started out as co-favorite with Snead to win top money, played the final round suffering from ptomaine poisoning. It was doubtful this morning whether he would be able to play. He finished the 18 holes in one-over-par 71 for a total of 273. He then was treated by a doctor before starting out for Texas. Grouped with Demaret at 273 were Wally Ulrich, Minneapolis, Minn., and Ralph Lomeli, Fresno, Calif.

## Kip Taylor Gets Hawkeye Eye

IOWA CITY, Ia., Feb. 5 (AP)—Two University of Iowa officials left today on a tour of the country to interview candidates for the Iowa football coaching position.

Athletic Director Paul Brechler and Dr. Paul Blommers, chairman of the athletic board, said they planned to interview all the 19 or 12 candidates still in the running for the job.

Brechler said the tour will take them to both east and west coasts and "several other places." He declined to reveal their exact destinations because "you wouldn't have much trouble then guessing who we were going to talk to."

## The Norwegians Again....

### Bjornstad Soars To Ski Jump Title

LAKE PLACID, N. Y., Feb. 5 (AP)—Hans Bjornstad, a 21-year-old Norwegian gardener, won the World Ski Jumping championship today with an amazing combination of distance and form. Bjornstad jumped 224 and 223 feet (68½ and 68 meters) on his two trials on the 65 meter intervals Olympic Hill to score 220.4 points.

Bjornstad won by a margin of six points over Thure Lindgren, 28-year-old Swedish electrician, who had jumps of 218 and 214 feet (66½ and 65 meters) for a second place score of 214.4.

The young Norwegian's performance was all the remarkable for his great combination of form and distance and because he was a late addition to the team. He won his place on the squad at Skul, Norway, ten days before it departed for America.

It is very rare in ski jumping for one man to get both the greatest distance and the top point score on form, but Bjornstad was easily the best in both respects today.

Arthur Devlin, Lake Placid, former U.S. ski champion, took sixth place to break into the Scandinavian monopoly of the leaders. Devlin had fine leaps of 220 and 219 feet, for 211 points.

Arnfinn Bergman of Norway was third with 213.5 points. Following him came Christian Mohr, Norway, 212.4; Torbjorn Falkanger, Norway, 211.9; Devlin, Petter Hugstad, Norway, 210.1; Georg Thrane, Norway, 207.9; Matti Pietikainen, Finland, 207.7 and Vidar Lindboe-Hansen, Norway, 206.2, tenth.

That gave the Norwegian team seven of the first ten places. Sweden, besides taking a surprising second place, took eleventh with Evert Karlsson, who scored an even 206 points.

Devlin's jumps of 220 and 219 feet (67 meters on each) left him behind only Bjornstad on distance. Pietikainen, the Finn who had one jump of 219 feet, also managed to break the Norwegian monopoly.

Ski jumpers were timed in full flight for the first time today and it was found they are traveling as fast 50 miles per hour when they take off.

A time interval meter was installed at the takeoff and as each skier passed his body intercepted two parallel beams of light eight feet apart across the track.

Highest speeds recorded were 50.4 miles per hour by Ralph Bielta of Ishpeming, Mich., Andreas Daescher of Switzerland and Geor Thrane of Norway.
