

Bradley Club Again Tops

Buckeyes 2nd In AP's Vote

Crusaders Rank 3rd; Ukes in 6th Place

NEW YORK, Feb. 27. (AP)—Bradley university's basketball Braves scored a double victory off the court today.

The popular, doughty leads from Peoria, Ill., accepted an invitation to compete in the National Invitation Basketball tournament in Madison Square Garden and for the second week in a row were picked as the No. 1 court team of the country in the Associated Press poll. Ohio State was ranked second and Holy Cross' unbeaten Crusaders were named third.

Two other outstanding quintets, Duquesne U. of Pittsburgh, and St. John's U. of Brooklyn, also accepted bids to the 12-team N.I.T. tournament which will be held March 11, 13, 14, 16 and 18. Several other quintets are expected to be picked for the Garden tourney shortly.

Duquesne (22-1) is fifth in this week's poll, a drop of one peg from the week previous. St. John's, which seems to have lost its mid-season edge, ranked tenth in the poll, a big skid from their previous sixth place ranking.

Bradley (25-3) was accorded a stiff tussle in the poll contest by Ohio State's (18-3) newly crowned Western Conference champions. Bradley accumulated 42 first place votes and 1,214 points on a 10-9-8-7 etc. basis to 10 first place votes and 1,128 votes for Ohio State.

The Big Teners, picking up plenty of support because of their pennant win in a strong conference, nosed out Holy Cross by 87 points. The Crusaders, already chosen for the District No. 1 berth in the N.C.A.A. tourney, garnered 1,041 points and 38 first place nominations.

Kentucky's young, improving Wildcats (22-4) moved into fourth place followed by (5) Duquesne, (6) U.C.L.A., (7) Western Kentucky, (8) North Carolina State, (9) La Salle, and (10) St. John's.

NEW YORK, Feb. 27. (AP)—Bing Crosby, the movie and radio star who sponsors his own golf tournament, has filed an entry for the 1950 British Amateur golf championship at St. Andrews, Scotland, May 22 to 27. The entry of Crosby was received today at the United States Golf association offices.

Crosby, who has sponsored the Bing Crosby Open for several years, entered from the Los Angeles Country club of Los Angeles, where he is rated as a three handicap golfer. Although he never has played serious tournament golf, he has competed frequently with top flight professionals in pro-amateur events.

for Coach Harold Hauk's team for the 1949-50 season. Final statistics on the team pointmaking disclose that Rogers swished 225 points in the 24-game season, on 97 field goals and 51 free throws. He finished 20 points up on Captain Daryl Girod, the team's driver-guard.

Jim Rock, who shared the forward berths mostly with Rogers, finished third with 158 markers. As a team the Salems took 1352

shots during the season, and connected with 439 for a snappy .331 average. They annexed 1218 points in all during their 19-won, 5-lost campaign.

The five Salem losses were to Oregon State Rooks (twice), Jefferson of Portland, Lebanon and Bend. Salem walked off, Lebanon and Bend in other games during the season also. Victories were notched over those three quintets, La Grande, Klamath Falls, Tigard, Hillsboro, Eugene, Albany, Corvallis, Springfield, Tillamook, Roosevelt of Portland and Astoria.
